

Time for another Benchrest match, the East West, held in St Louis every year in June. I didn't shoot particularly well. In fact, I butchered my first yardage like a two year old with a plate of mashed potatoes, but then climbed up with each subsequent yardage. Sort of a moral victory, I suppose, if you believe in those things. Tony Boyer was lamenting about how good gear was hard to find and how he's not handling conditions like he used to. So of course, he aged us all to death and won. I had hoped to have a couple of other matches under my belt before this one, but life sort of interferes with plans now and then. I finally got the Tahoe packed and hit the road. It wasn't as crammed in there as usual. I think pulling the seats and putting that plywood ledge in there really helped. Too bad Chevy thinks that all Tahoe owners want to do is pack it with kids watching DVDs and playing video games over the Internet with a wifi hot spot and an Onstar subscription. I told the salesman when I bought this thing that I didn't know 6 other people I wanted to be in a vehicle with. He laughed.

Truly a first class facility. Below is the club house at the far end. The covered firing line is on the right and hosts 60 well spaced benches.

For some odd reason, the weather was actually guite cool and dry this time. I wasn't complaining, because usually there are heat warnings out this time of year. Typically, I see small children and elderly citizens spontaneously combustion when driving to the motel in the late afternoon. Not this time.



Here's a couple of shots of the inside. I think Benchrest is one part golf, one part drag racing, and one part pissing off liberals and prairie dogs with high precision rifles. And these next shots show the equipment aspect of the sport. This is just like the pits at a race and is where everyone keeps tuning loads and cleaning barrels for the duration. It's really hard to set all this stuff up outside and deal with the elements, this is a much more civilized way to manage your mayhem.





And in one of the best cases of dude amenities I've seen anywhere, they included a special putting green in the head for everyone's practice while taking care of business. My wife doesn't get the hauling newspapers, lap tops, unabridged editions of War and Peace into the bathroom, so this really impressed her. Ah, it is good to be a guy.

Continuing our tour of the range, let's go out to the line. Here we see a view of the back of the benches and then the front. Note the generous spacing and very nice overhang in front of the benches. Wish all ranges were set up this way. You'll still get a little mist with a heavy north wind when it rains here, but it beats what it could be. A little mist is better than huge alligator drops like we saw from the Hillary lovers after the last election,





OK, with the intro to the layout complete, understand that the camaraderie in this sport is pretty good. Especially in those few days before the match when everyone is arriving and getting set up.

And a more respectable shot of Darryl Loker getting into the zone. He shot very well and handled some incredibly adverse conditions, winning the Heavy Varmint 200 yardage. Should have cropped the other guy out, he adds nothing.



It's all good and everyone got dialed in and ready to go for Saturday am. Here we have the usual semi-controlled chaos known as "flag setting", consisting of an odd coordination of dropped phone calls, two way radios with dead batteries, and cryptic hand signals to assist in flag locating. This is a critical time filled with profanity and golf cart bumper cars.





So with this out of the way, we can start the match and it gets pretty active on the line. Here the target crew is swapping out targets for the next relay. They have a 600 yard (I believe) range that you

can see in the background here.



Here we see Ralph Stewart demonstrating excellent free recoil form. Note he has one point of contact - his trigger finger on a 1.5 ounce trigger. Even his shoulder is slightly off the stock. In all precision rifle shooting, gun handling is very critical and it's so hard to remain consistent throughout the day and week, under mental and physical stress. Because of this, most Benchrest competitors use this technique to keep from influencing the recoil and its effect of a bullet on target. Some shooters do hold on, but they also model for statues and have anti-freeze in their blood stream. I am not so fortunate.



Enough room to shoot, clean, and race go carts.







Some Neat Benchrest History

A rare 1st Edition copy of "The Ultimate In Rifle Precision" (1951). These were produced from 1949 - 1954 as annuals. The Sportman's Press, Washington DC, published the first three years and Townsend Whelen did the editing. H.L. Culver gave it to my dad shortly before his death. This was Culver's personal copy that Col. Whelen presented to him in '51. Culver hand signed the cover but unfortunately Whelen didn't autograph it.

As you can see though it was signed by many of the founders of benchrest shooting. Warren Page, Harvey Donaldson, Al Marciante, Gene Hudgins, and RK Nelson to name a few. Culver was part of a very elite group that laid the groundwork for modern precision shooting. My dad and I spent a lot of time with him at the range and in his shop building powder measures, actions, and benchrest rifles. I hope to put out an article on the old guy someday.



Larry Boers Wins 2017 NW Regional HV/UNL Andrews Memorial

On June 3rd the NW Regional HV/UNL was held in Tacoma at TR&RC. The winner took home the 1st annual Andrews Memorial Award, which honors two bench rest brothers who recently passed within a year of each other. Denny and Bruce Andrews contributed significantly and were great ambassadors to our sport. This year's winner is Larry Boers and he celebrated by stuffing all the dollar bills he had won into his trousers, at the waist, like a grass skirt. Unfortunately, nobody thought to bring a ukulele!

17 shooters came together on Saturday morning under a cloudy grey sky with the temperature in the 60's. The wind was mostly light with occasional lulls. Jim Lynn shot a nice .125 small group and Larry Boers took the HV 100 agg with a .2108, besting Jeff Lewis's second place agg of .2280.

As the wind increased during the afternoon, Mustafa Bilal shot a screamer small group of .191. Dan Kjelland cobbled together a .2015 agg which won the HV 200, over Larry Boers's .2200 agg. But at the end of the day it was Larry who won the HV grand with a .2154, beating Dan's .2367 second place agg.

On Sunday the rail guns made their season debut. We had 10 rail guns and 2 bag guns competing in UNL class 5 shot matches. The sky started out overcast again, but soon became mostly sunny. Conditions were good, with light and fairly constant winds. By the 5th match it was pretty much calm. Larry Muller shot a screamer small group of .230. But Jeff Lewis put together the UNL 200 winning grand agg of .1795, just beating Larry Boers at .1806.

By noon Mustafa was sensing a problem with his rail gun and trying various fixes. Finally, he just tightened all the screws and promptly shot a screaming .049 small group, a pending world record. Jeff put together a fantastic .1380 agg to win the UNL 100 grand, beating Larry Boers's fine .1696 agg. By day's end Jeff had prevailed, piecing together the winning .1587 UNL grand agg and beating Larry Boers's .1751 second place agg.

When the weekend's shooting was over it was Larry Boers who emerged at the top of the score sheet with a HV/UNL winning .1952 grand agg. Jeff came close with his .2036 grand agg but he had to settle for second. Over the weekend a total of 6 screamer groups were shot by Mustafa, Jeff and Larry Muller.

Finally, we wish to thank Jim & Karen Lynn, Zach Silverton, and Craig Kensler for all their efforts in putting together a great match. Next month is the big Sniper King / Agg King / Sam Wilson Memorial match where we'll have lots more rail gun action. Hope to see you there!

HOW TO USE A TSI TUNERS

How I use my TSI tuners First a little information about the

tuner ---

The ID threads are 7/8 - 32 TPI or .875-32 TPI

I thread about 1" to 1 1/4 "of the muzzle, depending mostly on how I feel that particular day.

DO NOT try to remove the large nut that holds the rubber insert on. ----- It is not intended to be removed ever.

The way I use my tuners.

- I set the gun up to accept the tuner - (thread the muzzle end of your barrel).
- 2. Put the rifle together and do not install the tuner.
- Go to the range and tune the rifle as you normally would. Make it shoot as good as you can.
- On the same day and in the same conditions, install the tuner. Use a nice, heavy grease on the threads and apply this grease to both the tuner ID threads and the barrel OD threads. I use bolt lug lube. Screw it all the way on the barrel till it stops against the shoulder then back it off at least half of a turn and lock it down. This way you only have one way to go while tuning. You can't go further on the barrel as you will hit the shoulder quickly.
- 5. I then load up whatever shot well without the tuner on the gun and shoot a 3-shot group.
- If the rifle sticks them, (you got lucky) mark that spot with a felt tip or such and shoot it again except this time I would shoot a 5-shot group. If I wasn't fooled and it stuck them again, I would move the tuner out 1/8 of


a turn and shoot it again. If it still sticks. I would continue to move the tuner out 1/8 turn at a time and shoot 3-shot groups until it quits sticking.

- 7. I would put the tuner in the middle of where it was sticking, lock it down, and never move it again.
- 8. If the rifle tries to go out of tune, I would change powder charge just as if there was no tuner on the rifle.
- If the rifle shoots big after installing the tuner on the muzzle, (this is the norm) just shoot 3-shot groups and start turning the tuner out 1/8 turn at a time until you find the area where it will stick them. I find that the rifle will usually come into tune before you have made one complete turn, but no big deal if you have to go a little more than one turn
- 10. I try to find an area where the tuner can be turned thru about three 1/8 turn moves and still

shoot. As you move the tuner out, you will find that there are areas where the rifle will shoot well in a very small spot but when you turn the tuner another 1/8 turn it will go big on you. Try to find a broader area to leave the tuner --- life will be better if you can find an area where you can make the three moves and the rifle continues to shoot well.

In my experience with these things, I think I've never seen a barrel that actually did go to shooting better because of a tuner. What I think the tuner does do is help to keep your rifle in tune thru a larger range. I think that you will see that your rifle stays in tune better thru atmospheric changes than it would without a tuner.

Let me know what you think, after you've had a chance to mess with it.


