

Montana State Long Range (200/300 yd.) Whittecar Rifle & Pistol Club Varmint for Score: June 5th Hunter Class: June 6th

Very few shooters have had the opportunity to shoot at the Whittecar Rifle & Pistol Range, which is located in the Bitterroot Valley south of Missoula, Montana. The range is located at 3500 feet at the base of the Bitterroot Mountain Range which tops out at about 10,000 feet. The Whittecar Range sits right in the middle of the valley with the unpredictable north/south wind and the wind from the west down a large drainage area between mountain peaks.

On Saturday, the VFS 200/300 yd, was a challenge for all the shooters. I can't speak for all the shooters, but for me it was very humbling. No two flags pointed the same direction at the same time. The first flag could indicate a fast left to right, second flag could show a slow right to left and the third flag sat there like it was glued in place. During this time, the mirage was boiling straight up. Shooting style for the day was "Dumb A Luck" You could not dial your scope on high power and still make out the rings on the bulls. It was pretty comical looking at the targets when posted and see how many shots were taken at the "sighter." If you want to test your shooting skills, wing reading, beginners luck, or "Dumb A Luck", come to Hamilton, Montana.

As for the 200/300 yd hunter class.....please read paragraph one and two......minus about 9 mph on the wind speed. Only advantage with the hunter class, was that with the six power scope, the mirage didn't "look" quite as bad, but it was still a major factor at the scoreboard. The wind and mirage stopped when new targets were being set and during the lunch break. Funny how that works. If you want to experience the same conditions without coming

to our range, try this: mount some car leaf springs to the bottom of your shooting bench and shoot during a six magnitude earthquake.

The 4th Lowell Hottenstein Memorial Match was held the weekend of June 12th and 13th at the Western Wayne County Conservation Association (WWCCA) range in Plymouth, MI. A total of eighteen shooters had to master their loadtuning skills for the muggy hot temperatures on Saturday and the extremely low humidity (not common to Southeast Michigan) conditions of Sunday. Unfortunately, again the Covid-based border restrictions prevented our Canadian friends from participating. However, the match brought in several past competitors to WWCCA, including Hall of Fame shooter Joe Krupa and Firearm Industry businessman Bill Gravatt.

Prior to the start of shooting on Saturday, Joe Krupa provided a brief tribute to recognize Lowell Hottenstein before we all had a moment of silence in his memory. Several of the newer shooters did not have the opportunity to ever meet Lowell, so Joe told a story about a phrase Lowell would always say just when you think it can't go any worst and you're ready to pack up and go home. He would say in a very calming and an encouraging way, it's time for you to "Scratch and Claw".

We started on the 12th with the Light Varmint class at 100 yards. The weather for the morning match was hot, humid and calm winds, i.e., a trigger pull. When the smoke cleared there was three teen aggs. The lowest belonging to Steve Theye (of Benchrite LLC), a great agg of .1700. Local shooter Tim Bassham finished second with a super nice .1742, and Kurt Schultz finished third with a .1838 agg. Steve Theye also squeaked out a fine .110, which held up the Small Group honors.

As we started the afternoon 100yard Heavy Varmint match the winds were up a little with the temps climbing to near 90, and the humidity was still high.

This time only one shooter was able to muster a teen agg, and that was Pat Reagin (of PMA Tool) who fired a winning agg of .1908. In second place was Lee Hachigian with a .2068 agg, and in third was Ron Bush with a .2824 agg. The small group was shot again by Steve Theye with a very nice .123. After the shooting was over, WWCCA hosted their wellknown steak dinner cookout.

On Sunday the shooters were welcomed to a beautiful sunny day with comfortable temperatures and dry humidity, but the winds were up, so the shooters needed to be on their game to do well. Heavy Varmint was fired first at 200 yards. Lacy Tilley seemed to have everything working and posted a fine agg of .2110. Lee Hachigian finished second, with .2289. Pat Reagin finished third with a .2563 agg. Lacy had the small group of the match of .219.

In the afternoon 200-yard Light Varmint match, conditions continued to be a challenge. In third place was Pat Reagin with a .2647. Sneaking just ahead of him for the second place was Tim Bassham with a .2587. Winning the range agg was DeWayne Wood with a fine .2438. Exceptional for the conditions also was the small group turned in by Steve Theye of .249.

When it was time for the Grand Agg and 2-Gun gun awards we were pleased to see that many competitors remained to cheer for the winners and enjoy some ice-cold refreshments in WWCCA's fine club house. Light Varmint Grand Aggregate was won by Tim Bassham with a .2165. In second and third was Pat Reagin with a .2331 and Kurt Schultz with a .2413, respectively. The winner of the Heavy Varmint Grand Aggregate was Lee Hachigian with a .2179. In second place was again Pat Reagin with a .2236, and in third was Steve Theye with a .2476.



# 2021 Agenda Items for the Board of Directors (The annual Board of Directors meeting to be held on Saturday, September 18, 2021)

## **Eastern Region Agenda items:**

- 1) Move the 200 yard unlimited to Saturday instead of Thursday for the NBRSA Nationals. I think that might get us a few more shooters that shoot bag guns only. Submitted by Don Rosette.
- 2) Allow our Alternate Regional Directors to fully participate in our annual BOD meeting. Currently, our Alternate Regional Directors are permitted to attend our annual BOD meeting, but unable to join in any of the discussions. This discussion restriction has resulted in discouraging all of our Alt. Directors from attending our annual BOD meeting over the past years, stifling the exchange of membership feedback and new growth ideas. Submitted by Jack Neary.
- 3) Allocate up to 60 minute agenda time during the annual BOD meeting for any members wishing to meet privately with our Board of Directors to review any issues or growth opportunities within the NBRSA. Submitted by Jack Neary.
- 4) Introduce a "Show Your Bolts" Range Master command requirement immediately after the cease-fire command during all NBRSA discipline registered matches Long Range/Score and Group. I believe we have become much more cavalier regarding our gun safety at the firing-line, regarding all shooters remaining at the bench until the cease-fire command. The addition of a "show your bolts" bolts command after the cease-fire command will help prevent any potential dangerous safety issues with a loaded rifle leaving the firing line. Submitted by Jack Neary.
- 5) Create specific Long Range, Score and Group membership volunteer committees to properly focus on any pertinent operational issues and for the sustainable growth of each respective NBRSA shooting discipline. Each of these shooting committees would report, at least on a quarterly basis, during a BOD conf. call meetings their respective emerging issues or activities. Submitted by Jack Neary.
- 6) Install a two-term limit for all Regional Directors, Vice-President and President leadership roles within the NBRSA. This proposed two-term would help prevent complacency, provide new leadership strategies and provide increased opportunities for more members to participate in the steering direction of the NBRSA. In the event of the lack of an opposing candidate during a given NBRSA officer election, the unopposed incumbent Regional Director, VP and/or President would continue to serve in his/her current leadership role for the next 2-year term. Submitted by Jack Neary.

## **Gulf Coast Region Agenda items:**

We met and had our annual Gulf Coast membership meeting on Saturday May 1st at the Bluebonnet at New Braunfels. The issue with the Seb front bag that happened where two shooters were disqualified at Midland at the Buffalo Shoot because their front sandbag was made with a dip in the middle of the bag to where the sandbag could not be made to make full contact across the forend of the rifle stock.

This is the way that the current rule reads with regard to the front sandbag.

Sandbags:

CURRENT RULE as written in the

Revision #43 Jan 2021 online rule book.

2.11.1. The front sandbag. The front shall be a bag, without additions, containing sand only, and at least 1/2" thick over its entire surface. The portion which contacts the rifle shall contact the entire surface under the fore end. Tape on the sandbag is legal.

Agenda Change Item 1, A or B Proposed Change to 2.11.1

Α.

2.11.1 The front sandbag(s). The front sandbag shall be a bag(s) without additions, containing sand only, and at least 1/2" thick at any point where it contacts the rifle stock. Tape on the sandbag is legal.

OR

B

2.11.1 The front sandbag(s). The front sandbag shall be a bag(s) without additions, containing a pliable non-metallic filler, and at least 1/2" thick at any point where it contacts the rifle stock. Tape on the sandbag is legal.

This agenda item was **presented by Darryl Whitman** and voted to send as an agenda item to the annual directors meeting by the 30 members present at the regional meeting.

Below on the left is a photo of the Seb bag that was ruled illegal at Midland according to the above rule 2.11.1 in black above. The bag dips down in the middle of the bag and it can not be raised up in the middle of the bag to make full contact with a flat bottomed forend. The photo on the right is of another bag that would also not be legal for NBRSA competition according to rule 2.11.1 as currently written. Technically, as I read the rule as it is written, the front sand bag is a single bag as it is written "it shall be a bag". Changing the rule to front sandbag(s) allows that more than one sandbag

can be used. Without having the front rest in the left hand photo in front of me, the sandbag in the photo appears to be a separate bag on the left and a separate bag on the right side with a separate bottom bag. This is made so that a single front rest can be used with forends of different widths. The shooter moves the bag on each side of the forend in or out to accommodate the width of your forend. I can particularly see this being of benefit to someone who has taken advantage of the NBRSA sporter class rules that have in effect done away with the 3" wide forend width restriction. You either have to have something like this or you have to have at least a separate top for your existing front rest if you are going to take advantage of the change to the sporter class rules. I personally see no reason why the bag on the left should be illegal or the one that is shown on the Mini front rest in the right photo. Making either of these two rule changes would seem to be consistent with the stated objectives of the NBRSA especially line 1.1.1 of the objectives as stated in this email below the two photos shown. With either change to the rule book shown in the blue lettering above as A 2.11.1 or B 2. 11.1, both of these front sand bags would be legal sandbags. I am sure that both of these front sand bags were developed with F-Class matches in mind and not designed to circumvent NBRSA rules. Either of these changes would do away with the requirement that the front sandbag make full contact under the forend of the stock. Change B. would also allow other fillers to be used besides sand. It may not be necessary to make that change and other materials to fill the bag may not be any better, but at least with this change people could try other fillers and be able to compete and prove in competition whether it made a difference or not. It would still have to be a pliable material and lead shot would still not be legal to use as a filler. I think as a sport the last thing that we want to become is so hung up on standardizing our competition that we lose innovation.

NBRSA Proposed Rule Change – 6/1/2021, Submitted by Jason Peterson

The suggested rule changes are designed to change the relay and aggregate formats to achieve the following objectives:

1. Ensure that a competitor does not get to shoot ALL their targets at one time while other shooters work the pits or wait for their opportunity. It is quite common, especially at ranges in the Western U.S., for conditions to grow progressively worse in terms of both wind and mirage. The current relay structure virtually ensures that different relays shoot in much different conditions.

Studies of past matches have shown that shooters that shoot in the first relay almost always have the advantage and are commonly seen at the top of the group/score standings.

To try and make the format more equal we are suggesting that the match proceed in this order:

- Relay 1 shoots first 2 LG targets
- Relay 2 shoots first 2 LG targets
- Relay 1 shoots first 2 HG targets
- Relay 2 shoots first 2 HG targets
- Relay 1 shoots last 2 LG targets
- Relay 2 shoots last 2 LG targets
- Relay 1 shoots last 2 HG target
- Relay 2 shoots last 2 HG targets
- 2. Expand aggregates from 3 to 4 targets for both LG and HG to establish a better standard to determine the winner of each class and the overall 2 gun, match champion.
- 3. The number of record shots for LG and HG will not change. LG will continue to be 5 record shots per record target. HG will continue to be 10 record shots per record target.

### Responses to likely questions:

- 1. Will this require existing records to be retired? Yes EXCEPT in the case of single TARGET records (for score or group). All records will be retired to make room for new aggregative records that reflect the new 4 target format. It is our suggestion that we wait until the end of the first year of the format change to measure and finalize any new aggregate records. The match director will retain the TOP THREE sets of winning targets from each match during that year. At the end of the year, match directors and records committee shall review all winning entries and submit the best group/ score aggregates to the records director for official scoring/measurements.
- **2. Will people be willing to rotate more frequently?** The hope is that people will recognize that the benefits of the new format, in terms of equalizing match outcomes, outweighs the small inconvenience of having to rotate more frequently. With some practice, competitors should become more efficient in transitioning off benches and to the pits. Preliminary discussions with competitors of ALL AGES have revealed strong support for the suggested changes.

Revised Portions of Rulebook

- \*\*\*Note suggested rule changes impact the following parts of the current rule book in the order they appear. The changes are bolded and underlined and previous rules are denoted by [-]. Unless superseded by the rule changes, all other rules will remain unchanged.

A Competitor may choose to shoot only Light Gun or only Heavy Gun class on any day of the of the Tournament.

- 3.1.6.3. Two Gun group aggregate (eight or sixteen targets) [(six or twelve targets)] is calculated by adding together the Light Gun and Heavy Gun group aggregates and dividing by two.

## 3.1.7. Score Aggregates

- 3.1.7.1. Light Gun score aggregate is calculated by totaling the Light Gun record string scores (four or eight targets) [(three or sixtargets)] including X's.

- 3.1.7.3. Two Gun score aggregate (eight or sixteen targets) [(six or twelve targets)] is calculated by totaling the Light Gun and Heavy Gun score aggregates including X's.
