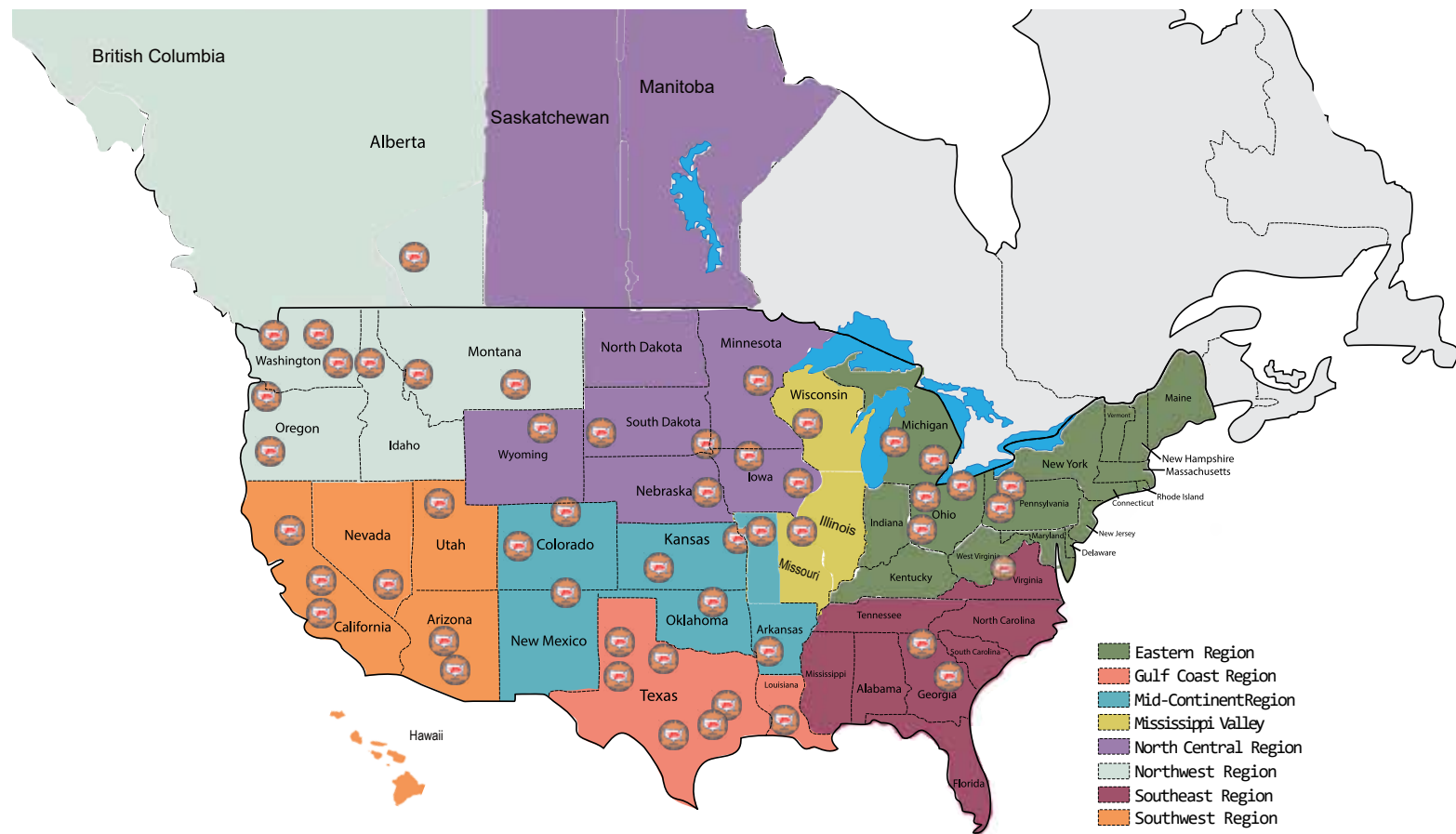

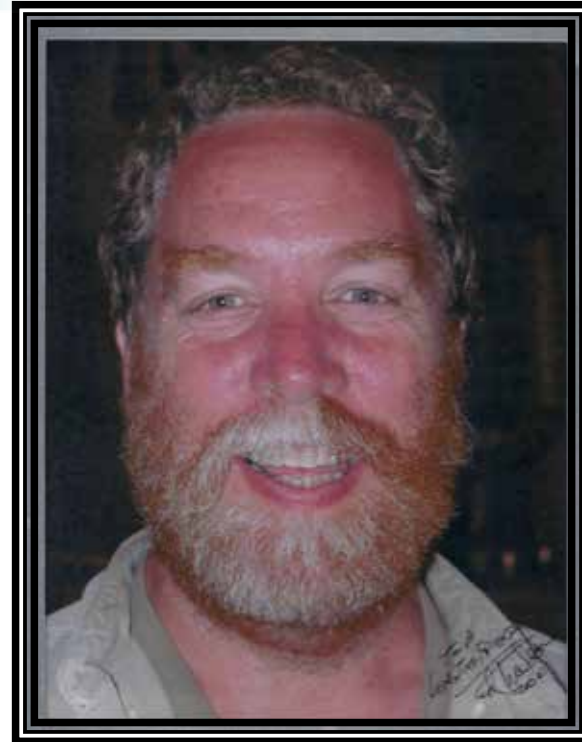

It's that time of year again:

Super Bowl, Waste Management Phoenix Golf Tournament and the Warm-up for the Cactus Classic.

The golf tournament was limited to 5K spectators a day when in years past they had as many as 100K/day. It is billed as the Greatest Show on Grass. Since many spectators couldn't go to the TPC Scottsdale for Golf we invited them to the Cactus Classic Warm-up Benchrest match at Ben Avery. The crowd behaved themselves and the match went on without any issues.

The match started off with cold/cool temps in the morning and at times very unpredictable winds gusting over 18 mph. First up was the Light varmint 100. Ed Adams didn't start the match off great; in fact his first target was the worst of his aggregate, a .289. He made up for it though, with a .083 (small group) for the yardage in the second match. Ed went on to win the next two matches as well, shooting a .155 and a .104. His pace at this point was a .157 agg. He shot OK for match 5 shooting a .260, not all that good, compared to his previous 3; but out of the 32 shooters on the line, 17 of them shot a .300 or larger. Ed finished up the yardage with a .1782. The crowd was really impressed with that agg especially given the wind conditions we shot in. Ed could have gone home at that point (most wished he would have), as it appears at this point Ed is ready for the Cactus match. Second place was Keith Cottrell .080 behind Ed with a .2582 and in third place was Bud Mundy with a .2686.

Next up was the heavy varmint 100. The wind conditions let up a bit, however the direction was continuing to change quickly. Temperature went up as well and at times it felt warm. The high for the day was 76. The shooters who

shot well in the morning maintained their performance in the afternoon. Winning the yardage was Bud Mundy shooting a .2250. Bud shot steady with a small of .192 and his biggest group was a .258. In second place was Lester Bruno with a .2276. Les was hurt by a .303 in the second match. His other four targets were nice and helped him place 2nd. In third place was Keith Cottrell with a .2312.

Keith started the aggregate with three one's; however he slipped on his fourth target shooting a mid three. It was easy to do; this day the wind was switching quickly. It almost looked like the wind moved the bullet before the flags would show it. Small group for the aggregate was a .145 fired by The Dukester Rovarino in match #4.

The largest group shot within that group of 10 was a .792. Nice conditions for nice groups but you had to pay attention to shoot a three. Small group for the yardage was a .268 shot by Mike Nagengast in match #2. Mike was shooting a .30 br and Bart's 112 bullets in front of 4198 powder.

Tips & Tricks

with NBRSA President Jack Neary

What are the shapes of your 200 yard groups telling you...?

Whenever possible, before the start of a BR Group match, I much prefer to tune my rifles at 200 yards vs. 100 yards.

Why?

200 yds is the true acid-test to confirm your bullet seating depth and powder load (in many cases) in order to obtain your rifles best tuning performance. So many times, where I only tuned at 100yds before the start of a match, I shot both 100yd LV and HV aggregates on Saturday, my rifle was just not quite shooting in tune as I may have thought...

When after the 200yd flag setting on Saturday afternoon, after the conclusion of the 100yd aggs, I would go out and retest the tune of my rifle at 200yds. Oh, the sickening feeling when I would test the exact same seating-depths and load, only to find out the seating depth was just a .002" - .005" off of where it needed to be to have my rifle properly tuned to cut conditions. Geez..... Although I am anxious to start tuning my rifles before the start of a match when I arrive at the range on Thursday or Friday, I am more disciplined to take the time to set-up my flags at a bench so I may tune my rifle at 200yds. It really pays off in revealing where the best seating depth so much easier than tuning at 100yds.

Okay... What am I looking for?

Whenever I tune my rifle at 200yds. there are 7 different group shapes which I closely review to let the "shape" of the group tell me what needs to be done to change my load to properly tune my rifle. I generally, based upon available time, will tune in shooting 4-shot groups at 200yds. As a basic rule, 3-shot groups will confirm your

seating-depth, and 4-shots will show you if your load is 80% correct or not. 5-Shots is the true acid test to confirm your load...

I must say... tuning your rifles in dead-calm conditions in the evening is a complete waste of time. Let's go to dinner! These loads will generally lie to you, especially if a little wind comes up!

First group shape... "Ugly Blob"

If my 4-shot group at 200yds is just a "splatter" with....LARGE bullet holes and no 2 bullets trying to touch, this load is way too light! Even at 200yds, you can discern your bullet hole sizes viewed through your scope. Large bullet holes are a direct result of a bullet that is under-stabilized from a lack of powder. Bullets are just wandering around the target with every small change in wind angle or velocity... Not good.

Second Group Shape... "Vertical"

By adding powder, if my next group is vertically shaped (group is a ring or more tall), it shows me my powder load is coming together, as bullets are trying to touch, but still lacking velocity stability... Please bear in mind, a little vertical is good in windy conditions (i.e. half-bullet at a 100yds / 2 bullets at 200yds.) However, you should not tolerate much vertical in less than windy conditions.

Third Group Shape...

"Weather Report"

Flat shaped groups deceive many Group shooters, as they place blame on themselves for simply missing the wind pick-ups. That may be true, but your load was still a little too light to "cut the condition!" Add more powder!

Fourth Group Shape... "Small ROUND group"... The holy grail...!

When your load is right even at 200yds, your bullets will try to go through the same hole on your target! Your rifle tune (bullet seating depth and load) is perfect where they even cut through windy conditions!

Fifth Group Shape... "The Dreaded 4 and 1" group.... &^%\$#@!

Pay close attention to this "4 and 1" shape group! Yes. It is entirely possible where the first 4-shots went into 1 bullet hole on your 200yd. target and perhaps the wind velocity or angle changed on your 5-shot. It happens... But... (very important) if your first 4-shots BURN.... a small hole (even at 200yds) hold on because your load is just a little too hot and the 5-shot will usually spit-out of the potential little group. Experienced shooters will pick-up on this "4 and 1" shaped group and back off their powder by .1 or .2 tenths of a grain for their next target.

Think of how many times you have heard in the loading area on Sunday during the 200yd aggregates... "My luck is bad... my groups are all 4 and 1 all day today". If you SEE what caused you to lose the shot out of the group, fine. Accept you missed a pick-up or wind angle change. But. if you did not did see what caused your lost shot out of the group, it's your load!

A VERY important tip... Look closely at the bullet hole shape and size of the bullet that jumped out of the group... Most of the time the bullet hole has a an odd-shape and may also be slightly smaller, due to the bullet being driven too hard by the hot load.(We take too much credit when our rifles shoot well and we also take too much blame when our rifles do not shoot well. You can't steer an untuned bullet!

Sixth Group Shape.... "3 and 2... double group"

This is your 2nd red-flag before your load completely blows-up! Your load is too hot when your 200yd groups form as "3 and 2" double-groups. Again, don't blame yourself for missing a condition, as this is rarely the cause of the dreaded "3 and 2" group shape. The load is just too hot.

Seventh Group Shape.... "5-shot Splatter" "agg killer" group!

This group shape is different than the First Group "Ugly Blob" Shape, in that you will notice your first shot backs-up into the condition and your other 4-shots all go in random directions on your target, defying what the wind angles show. Additionally, even from 200yds, your bullet holes will look like .17 caliber bullet holes.

Hope these group "shape" examples will help your rifle tuning skills and produces better aggregates for your next match!

Financial Officer's Report

for the Year Ended December 31, 2020

Financial Officer's Report for the year ended December 31, 2020

Despite a very tough year, the NBRSA managed to come through with a profit for the period under review. Our net income dropped From \$30,749 to \$13,964 (down \$16,785 compared with the previous financial year). Our cash balance increased from \$142,669 to \$163,508 (compared with December 31, 2019).

On closer inspection, our advertising revenue was down \$2,075 and target-sales dropped \$4,310. This was expected as over 70 registered matches were cancelled due to Covid-19 and others suffered lower attendance. For the same reason our match fees were down \$8,041 and membership dues declined \$3,579. All in all, our net income dropped \$19,357 which largely accounted for the drop in profit.

It is my opinion that the NBRSA remained financially healthy during a difficult period as every material difference in income can be attributed to an unprecedented pandemic. As the concern for the virus passes, we should expect our financial performance to rebound just as quickly.

MAKING OF THE MAGIC BULLET

Special Segment of "Ready On the Firing Line" by Lee Hachigian

This periodic feature of the magazine asks various questions on all aspects of precision shooting to Benchrest Hall of Fame members and seasoned benchrest shooters to seek out their thoughts, ideas and processes.

Question 1: If someone was going to start making their own benchrest bullets, what would be the one or two things you would say to them to get them started in the right direction?

Walt Berger

"Anyone can make good bullets if they work at it. Finding a good die maker is critical. Seek out those who are making their own and find out who they used to make their dies."

Jeff Gaidos

"I would recommend they read Chapter 14 of Tony Boyer's book, *The Book of Rifle Accuracy*...Find a mentor that is close to your shooting range so he/she can help you get started and be able to help you set up the equipment to lessen the learning curve. Making bullets is not hard, but getting the right start will make things a lot easier. Make sure you want to make bullets for the right reason(s)."

Chuck Miller

"First thing I would tell them is to get cores from Charlie Hood. Then make sure the cores are really clean. I use Walmart camping fuel which is white gas to clean with. There are a lot of choices for jacket lube. Lanoline and oil mixed together makes a good lube. I tumble the jackets for about 25 minutes for 1,000 jackets."

Ken Hottenstein

"Two words of advice. First word of advice is to buy a good die from either a die maker such as Detsch, Pinehardt, Ulrich or Niemi). You can also buy a used die but make sure that the bullets associated with the die have a good history behind it, or you will just be wasting time and

good materials if the die isn't good. Second would be, don't be afraid to try different weights, if 68 grain bullets don't work, try 67 or in between."

Question 2: In your experience, what is the most important/critical attribute you have to stay on top of to make a good bullet?

Walt Berger

"It's not as easy as it appears, but you have to have your heart into it and the patients they'll be just fine."

Jeff Gaidos

"Making bullets comes down to two things: lubing the jackets and core seating. Once you are comfortable with that then all else has little influence."

Chuck Miller

"Jackets change weight every year so matching core seating punches so you get a small amount of bleed buy on the seated core and core seating pressure will change also."

I like to see the core line on the jacket of the seated core."

Ken Hottenstein

"Be very consistent in everything you do. Make sure when lubing jackets, you use the same amount of lube every time, when lubing cores to be squirt, the same amount of Castor oil per 1000, also a good lot of jackets is important, and to have a large enough quantity of them to keep you in supply for years to come."

Question 3: I recall a railgun shooter doing extremely well using a short, flat-base and light 6mm bullet. Do you think enough shooters try different combinations of weight, ogive and shape bullets? When someone says, "What do you recommend I try?", what do you say?

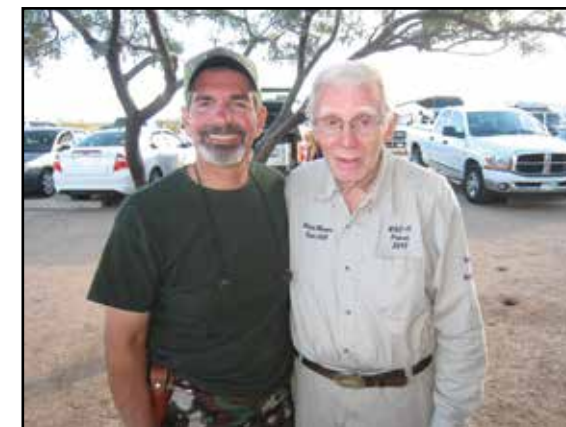
Jeff Gaidos

"If you have a 'good' bullet then I believe that more barrels look like a 'good' barrel provided the rifle is 'good.' Some bullets might favor a barrel manufacturer, twist rate or reamer...People have a tendency to chase


bullets they think are in favor or good at the time and this might not always be the best approach. The game has really progressed to the point where a serious shooter really needs to make their own bullets. Then you control the shape [ogive] by the die you buy, bullet weight, FB/BT, quantity and any of the other particulars that you deem are important."

Ken Hottenstein

"I think shooters tend to follow what is hot at the time. Twenty-five years ago, only a handful of shooters shot boat tails, then the early 2000's till current I would bet only a hand full of shooters are shooting flat base bullets. As for the ogive, that's all a shooter and their barrel's preference. I don't think people experiment like they did in the past as much, people want what is good at the moment and will use it until something else comes along. If a shooter calls and asks me what I recommend, I tell them the 7.10 1/2 BT bullets."

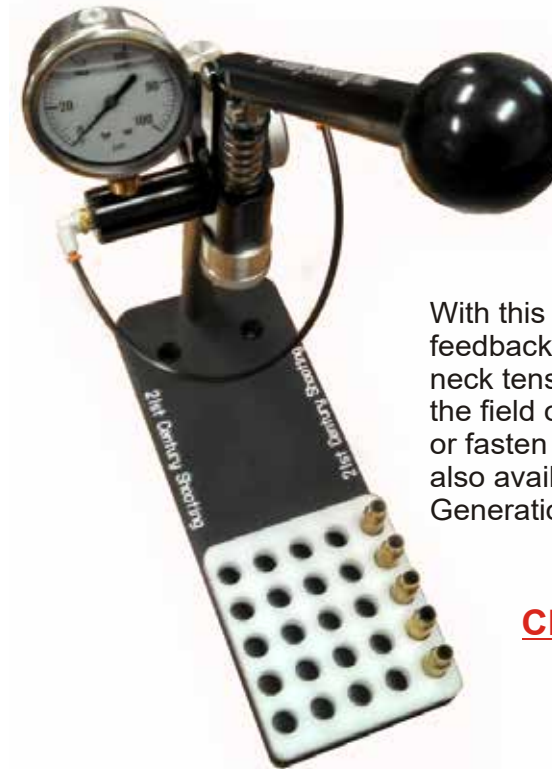

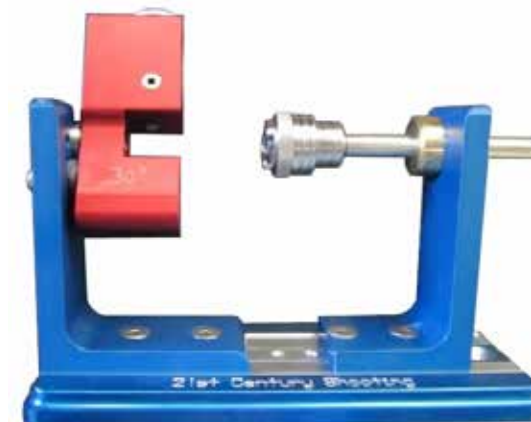
