NBRSA MEMBER OF THE MONTH

Tim Singleton

Tim Singleton lives in Waynesville, North Carolina, and has been shooting bench rest for six years. Though his favorite discipline is group, he also enjoys score. Tim's home range is Asheville Rifle and Pistol Club in North Carolina, though he attends matches throughout the Southeast Region. His favorites also include the Super Shoot, East West and Hog Roast.

"I really enjoy the SE regional championship matches," he says. "The Super Shoot is a great experience for a new shooter to see the competitors from all over the world coming together."

Though he has met a number of great people over the years, his closest benchrest buddies are Ralph Stewart and Eddie Harris.

When asked his greatest shooting accomplishment thus far in his career, Singleton had several answers. He finished second in the Southeastern Regional Championship 2-gun match a few years ago, firing

two teen aggregates that weekend. "Doing my own barrel work 3 or so years ago was a big accomplishment," Singleton said. The next step was making his own bullets, which has come with a learning curve. "No better thing in this sport than controlling these two things yourself. Then you can concentrate on learning how that combination behaves." Singleton aspires to win a two gun match.

Though memories abound, two stick out. When asked his greatest benchrest memory, Singleton cites his first win in Unaka, Tennessee, barely beating a fellow competitor on the last target (200 yards). His funniest memory is of Brady Knight and Scotty Grimes arguing on the line. "Those two always kept everyone laughing," he said.

Attending matches really exposes new shooters to people from across the country and around the world. Singleton advises new shooters to find a good mentor and to shoot every match they can.

NBRSA MATCH DIRECTOR & RANGE OF THE MONTH

Larry Tilley

Southwest Louisiana Rifle & Pistol Club



Southwest Louisiana Rifle and Pistol Club (SWLA) benchrest match director Larry Tilley has served as match director for SWLA for three years, though he has been an NBRSA member for 11.

He is a resident of Lake Charles, Louisiana and competes in all of the SWLA matches as well as Tomball for the Texas State VFS.

Tilley's favorite matches to host are the Louisiana State VFS and HTR as well as the Gulf Coast Region VFS and HTR. These matches are special not only because they are championships, but have a traveling trophy and better attendance.

He competes with a Jewell trigger, Farley action, Bartlein .30-17 twist in .30 BR, NF 42X scope, 10X 115 gr or 117 gr bullet, and an old style McMillan benchrest stock.

Tilley shot expert in the Marine Corps and in 2010 was invited to shoot in SWLA's factory class matches. His mentor, Ray Perry, got him started in benchrest shooting. Tilley started with a factory Remington rifle with a 5R barrel in .308 that had a black and green webbed H-S Precision stock that was made for Remington. He paired this with Federal match ammunition loaded with Sierra MK bullets. His second year shooting benchrest he won every factory class match. Ray Perry is also Tilley's gunsmith and taught him how to reload. Perry was also instrumental in Tilley's entry into the custom benchrest rifle world.

Tilley's favorite memory is winning the Louisiana State VFS in 2019. He also appreciates that most competitors arrive with loaded ammunition for VFS matches allowing for more time for visiting.

Southwest Louisiana Rifle & Pistol Club

SWLA has been a member of the NBRSA since the 1940's and has approximately 400 members. It is located 15 miles east of Lake Charles at 2720 Camp Road in Bell City, Louisiana.

SWLA hosts seven matches and four championship matches each year.

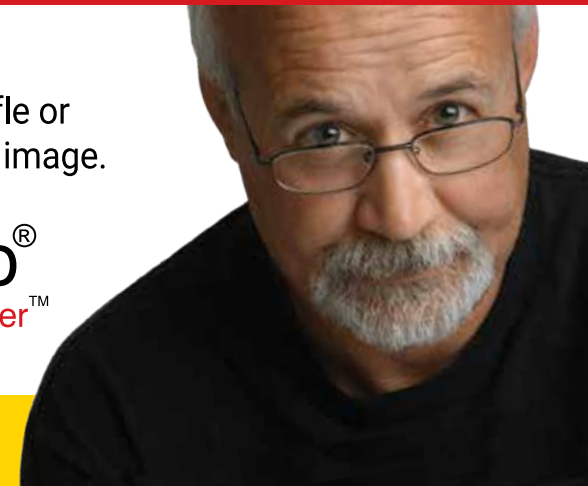

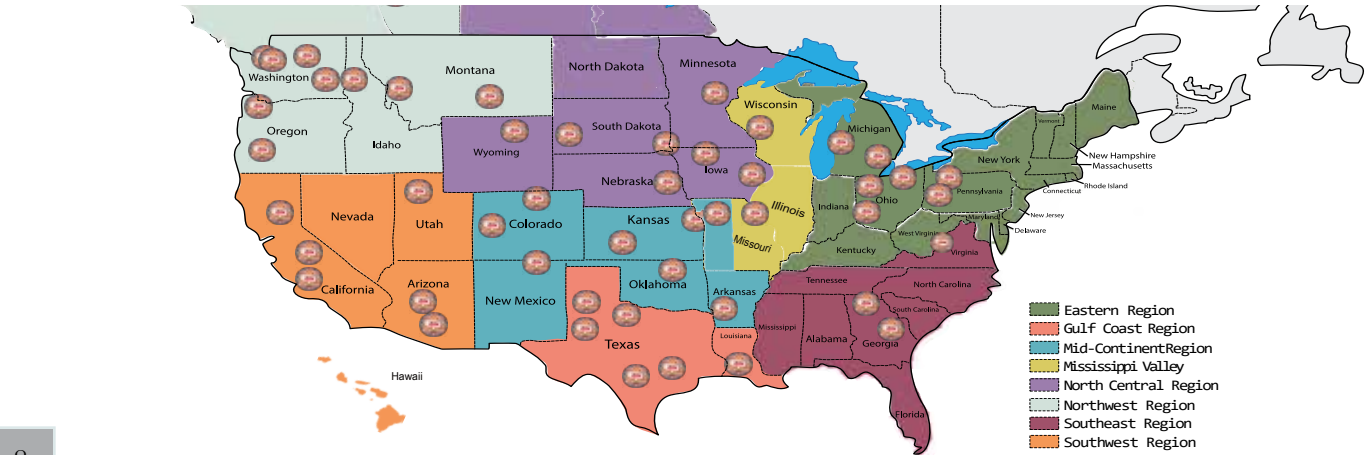

President’s Note

Hello Everyone!

Spring has finally arrived as we return to some warm weather and get the 2021 match season underway across all eight NBRSA re-gions.

Our good friend, Gary Ocock and other NBRSA members have recently inquired about our NBRSA organization leadership’s focus, regarding the evolvement process path in mea-suring our groups at our many ranges hosting registered NBRSA matches. Over many years, I have thought our current process of using caliper and a reticle to measure our groups seemed somewhat draconian in the current age of advanced computer technology. There simply must be a better way of measuring our groups much more accurately, and consistently by removing the human error element.

Chris Harris, our North Central Region Direc-tor and Financial Officer, using his own private resources and computer software expertise, recently and sought-out and hired a software engineer to design the software necessary to address and resolve the error in measuring our groups at our various matches

Like others, Chris recognized the importance of the consistent, accurate group measure-ments necessary to identify a 2-Gun Grand Aggregate winner when many times, even the 2-Gun winner was determined by as little as .0001” of an inch!

Sadly, the software engineer Chris had hired to

create the software algorithm program to accomplish his goal of using an affordable digital scanner to accurately scan and measure our groups, quit the project mid-stream.

Last fall, I communicated with Jeff Block, the head guru at “On Target” measurement software, regarding his software’s process in measuring group targets. While I believe the On Target software has potential to provide us with a greater level of group measurement accuracy, it has a distinct drawback. The On Target software still involves human error in placing the scoring reticle accurately over both of the furthest bullet holes. It also requires significant time to provide the group measure-ment size for the statistician to enter into the Bug Hole software program. The On Target software could work for smaller registered matches with fewer targets to be measured on a given relay, but as we all know, shooters want to see their targets and group measure-ment asap after their respective relays, without delay!

While we do not yet have a solution in evol-ving our group measuring process, please note my office and our NBRSA leadership team is keenly in-tune of the need to move this process forward and will prudently invest the dollars necessary to meet this goal.

Check Your Front Rest Sand Bag… Please Read!
Sadly, there were two NBRSA members

disqualified at a recent registered group match due to using a front sand bag with a new design inconsistent with NBRSA equipment rules.

The sand bags used did not have complete surface contact under the rifles stock forearm, as noted under our current NBRSA rules:

Sandbags: 2.11.1. The front sandbag. The front shall be a bag, without additions, contain-ing sand only, and at least 1/2” thick over its entire surface. The portion which contacts the rifle shall contact the entire surface under the fore end. Tape on the sandbag is legal.

Please reach out to your respective Regional Director or myself with any questions regard-ing this current Sandbag equipment rule.

MENTORSHIP AT THE SHAMROCK

April 8, 2021

The Mentoring Experience

When I started down the extreme accuracy road in 1995, I was essentially on my own. Articles in *Precision Shooting*, the Precision Shooting Reloading Guide and Glen Newick's *The Ultimate in Rifle Accuracy* were my only sources of information, and much of that was out of date. When I finally met some real benchrest shooters, who became my mentors, my knowledgebase increased rapidly.

When Jack Neary proposed starting an official NBRSA mentorship program I jumped on board. Since signing up for the program I have hosted several shooters at my practice range near Oneonta Alabama and even traded emails with a shooter in Finland. I have had the pleasure of mentoring two shooters new to the short range group game. One shooter, David McDowell, was able to attend the 2021 Shamrock in Dublin Georgia.

David is from Saraland Alabama. He is a long-time shooter in various disciplines, mostly pistol, but had dropped out of any competitive shooting for a number of years. A little over two years ago he started competing in 600 yard benchrest matches because that was what was available near his home, but he has been extremely interested in shooting short range group. He originally planned to come to my home practice range in February but a big cold snap put a crimp in those plans, so we decided to wait until the Shamrock.

David showed up Wednesday afternoon before the shoot. Although we managed to do some shooting that afternoon, we mostly spent the time evaluating his equipment and scrounging other equipment to get him up and running.

David has a Heavy Varmint on a Borden action as well as a Light Varmint rifle on a Cedar Mountain Machine stock, Bat DS drop port, B&A trigger, and Night Force 42X scope, so he is starting out with good equipment. We decided to focus on the Light Varmint. As the afternoon progressed, we found a number of issues with his reloading equipment.

First issue was his sizing die wasn't really right for his chamber, and in fact wasn't bumping the shoulder at all. Billy Stevens loaned him a sizing die, and after trying several shell holders we finally found a combination that would bump his shoulder. The next issue was that his press wasn't bumping consistently so Jeff Graves loaned him a Hood press.

As David was seating bullets he commented that some were seating with considerably less pressure than others. This prompted a session with my ball mic and we discovered that neck thickness was varying wildly. His brass was varying as much as half a thousandth from one side to the other. It turned out he was using a lathe to turn his brass and didn't realize the importance of letting the neck turner float during the turning process. I had some fireformed .268 neck brass as well as an extra Pumpkin neck turner, so we turned 20 pieces of brass down to .0082 and eliminated that problem.

David had one of the new inexpensive video borescopes that allow you view the bore on your computer screen. This was the first time I'd seen one and I was pleasantly surprised at the quality of the picture. We were able to see carbon-copper layering in his barrel, so I showed him a cleaning technique I learned from Wayne Campbell and in fairly short order his barrel was looking almost brand new.

The next morning we started shooting groups. David was using an Edgewood Gater rear bag and I noticed that the grip of his stock was hitting the bag during recoil. He switched to a Protektor bag he already owned and solved that problem. He was using a Frankford Arsenal front rest with a Shadetree top. The Shadetree top worked well but the front rest sits very high so we used donuts to raise the rear bag.

He was accustomed to pre-loading in his basement using precision scales, but that simply wouldn't work loading outside at the range. I had a backup Chagemaster, but I have always recommended that new shooters use a powder measure when they first start loading at the range. It can be tough cleaning and loading with the limited time between groups, so I loaned him my Neil Jones powder measure. By the end of the weekend he was throwing charges followed by checking with a small pocket scale.

David was using the jam method for working up seating depth. His rifle showed promise in that it would put 2 or 3 shots in a small hole, but he was getting high and low flyers. He was loading about 29.1 grains of N133 and after testing various powder charges he settled on around 28.8 grains. Moving up to the high 29 grain range caused groups to blow up every time, most likely a seating depth issue, so for the rest of the weekend he stuck to the high 28 to low 29 grain range. During Friday practice in light wind he was shooting reasonable groups and managed several in the 1s.

CONTINUED - MENTORSHIP AT THE SHAMROCK

Time constraints prevented experimenting with seating depth, but we did discuss the correct way to test and identify the best seating depth. He also observed Wayne Campbell demonstrating the correct way to determine the bullet touch point and we discussed how to use that method to find the correct seating depth. By the end of the weekend he made great progress on recognizing when a load wasn't right and how to adjust...now if only I could learn that lesson!

By the end of the weekend David had decided to jump in the deep end. He bought another rifle, powder measure and sizing die from Billy Stevens and is planning to upgrade his press, neck turner and front rest in short order.

This was a learning experience for me as well as David. Over the years I have tried to help a number of shooters with various aspects of benchrest, but never tried to concentrate this much training into such a short period of time. I identified a number of equipment and component issues that, in hindsight, should have been caught earlier in the process, so my recommendation to other mentors is to thoroughly evaluate the student's equipment, components and cleaning procedures at the beginning.

Mentoring David was a pleasure and I look forward to shooting with and helping him in the future. I urge other shooters to sign up for the NBRSA Mentorship program. Passing along the knowledge we have gained over the years is rewarding and will help us grow our membership and attendance.

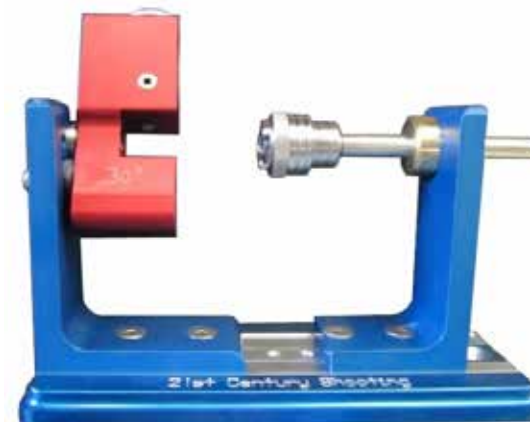
