Dr John Dumas, Clinical psychologist, came down from Oklahoma to help with any post Covid / Shoot stress issues.



The 2021 Texas Shootout was also the Gulf Coast Region's Unlimited and Sporter matches. Blessed with the abondance of rain over the past month, the range at Midland was in beautiful shape, I've never seen it so green and lush out here! We were also blessed with much cooler than normal temperatures than we normally have this time of year. Last year we suffered through temps of 110° and up! This past weekend, temperatures stayed in the mid to upper 80's throughout the afternoons! Another big change for us was the much higher humidity levels than we normally see in the summer months, in the mornings it would be as high as 92% and only drop down around the mid 40's in the afternoons. Those who have been here in the past, know that we normally see 60% as a high and can drop down in the upper to mid-teens in the afternoons.

Unlimited 100 yards was contested early Saturday morning, winds were light and coming out of the south/south east for the most part and around five miles per hour. Mike Conry started the morning off with a .150 small group in the third match, Speedy Gonzalez won the second with a .170. Jim Nicolas on his very first trip to Midland shot a .125 group in the third that wound up being the smallest group of the yardage. Jim followed that group up by winning match four with a .189. Kevin Black shot a .195 in the fifth and final match to win it but Jim's .2148 agg easily kept him at the top of the score sheet.

We shifted the target frames back to two hundred yards and after a lunch break, started up with the Unlimited guns again. The wind had started to pick up a bit, five to ten mile per hour and every once in a while would tease us with a quick shift out of the south west. Once again... Mike Conry was out of the gate with a .513 in match one. In match two, Kevin Blacks legendary barrel came to life and he recorded a .367 small group. Conry came back in the third with a .294 and in the fourth, Kelly Morman shot a .473 in worsening conditions.

Charles Huckeba won the final match of the day with a .480. Kevin Black won the yardage with a .2848 agg even with a .943 on the last target, that rifle just shoots! With the completion of the UL matches, Kevin Black won the Unlimited Grand with a .2631 agg, Conry was second, Charles Huckeba came in third, Speedy was fourth and Jim Cook rounded out the top five.

Sunday morning started out with a heavy overcast sky and threats of possible storms. Again, the temps were very comfortable, humidity was in the 90's and the winds from the south east around five miles per hour in the gusts! Perfect for sporters at 200 yards! I haven't figured out how he does it, but for the third yardage in a row, Mike Conry was at the top of the score sheet at the opening match, this time with a .205. Charles Huckeba won the second with a .250, Darryl Whitman won the third with a .385 as the early morning calm abandoned us. Gary Bristow won the fourth with a .338 and Mike Bryant nabbed the fifth match with a .445. Mike Conry's name never fell out of first place throughout the yardage and he easily won with a amazing teen agg of .1984! Not many teen aggs come out of Midland especially at 200 yards!

Target frames were shifted back to 100 yards and as soon as lunch was finished we started the final yardage of the weekend. There were pockets of blue skies starting to peek through the cloud cover, the wind had begun to switch around a bit letting us see a little bit of orange on the flags at times. Wind speed had also picked up and we started getting gust up to ten plus miles per hour. Kevin Black won the first match with a .170, someone finally broke Conry's run of winning each first match. In the second match, Charles Huckeba shot a .145 for the win, Gary Bristow shot a .160 in the third match. Mike Conry found something good to shoot in and eked out a .128 in the fourth match. Mike Bryant turned in a .173 group in the final match of the weekend and it was more than enough to take the win in the yardage.

With all the shooting completed, it was Mike Conry winning the Sporter Grand with a .2370 just .0013 ahead of Mike Bryant. Kevin Black was third, Charles Huckeba fourth and Kyle Schultz was in fifth place.

It was close in the Two Gun with Mike Conry leading with .2608, Kevin black right behind him with a .2634. Charles Huckeba was in third place, Speedy Gonzalez came in fourth and Mike Bryant was in the fifth place spot at the end of the weekend.

But Baggett (.2781) was fifth, just behind Steve Murphy, so he was crowned Sporter Champion for 2021 with a .2375. Adams's .2401 was good enough for second, and Gibson's .2646 third. Pennell and Mundy rounded out the top five.

#### Flag Sponsors and Setting at **Group Nationals** By Lee Hachigian

Thank God there are individuals (aka, Flag Sponsors) at the NBRSA National Championships that have enough flags and stands to accommodate five bench rotations. I asked several of them a few questions as to their technique and rationale for volunteering. Hope you enjoy the discussion. The NBRSA Rule associated with Flag Sponsor(s) is shown

4.10.4. At all Nationals, the individual who accepts the job of procuring and setting flags for a flag rotation (sponsor) will have control over what type and how the flags are set for that rotation. Any additions or adjustments to that rotation may only be done with the permission of the flag sponsor for that rotation. If that individual is unable to fulfill their duties as flag rotation sponsor, another sponsor will be approved by the Match Director.

Appeals to the flag set for a given rotation, not resolved with the sponsor, will be made to the referees for the first days' competition, with a majority vote of said referees being needed to change the flag set in question.

Question 1) Why do you frequently volunteer as a flag/bench sponsor at the National Championships? How do you like to set your flags; distance apart, targetto-bench angle/staggering, height, etc.?

#### The Author

Due to a lesser number of left-handed shooters, there was a need for more flag sponsors, and it allowed me to set up flags in a pattern that provides me the best ability to view and adjust to the given ranges conditions. So, I

set up my Smiley-style flags in a straight line from the right edge of the bench to the center of the target. I typically set 4 flags at 100-yards and 5 flags at 200-yards. I know most other flag setters use 6 (and sometimes 7) flags 200 yards, but I found them more confusing then helpful (for me it's just too much data to analyze). I set flags at 15-20, 40, 60 and 80 yards for 100-yard matches, and 20, 50, 80, 115 and 160 yards for 200-yards. I start with furthest flag away and set it 1-2" below the bottom of the target. Every subsequent flag is set lower so I can see almost ½ to ¾ the flag behind it (again in a straight line).

#### **Harley Baker**

The main reason I like setting a full rotation of flags is that I like all my 5 rows to look the same. mally like the row of flags to have a very shallow angle from the target to my bench, but if I am at a range that forces you to use very short poles, I will use the whole space that is allowed me. This means I will start my far flag 1/2 way between the target to the right and bring it back to 1/2 way between me and the bench to my left.

#### **Bob Hamister**

I volunteer as a flag/bench sponsor at all National Championships that I plan on attending for the last years. I prefer to use flags that I am familiar with. I know how they respond to wind speed and direction changes. Different flag types react differently. As a right-hand shooter, I like to set my flags at a very slight taper to the right from the 1st flag at 20 yards from the bench out to the 100-yard target. I would use four (4) flags for 100 yards. Each flag approximately 20 yards apart. The 4th flag at 80 yards would be centered under the target. For 200 yards I would add

two (2) flags. Both centered under the target. The 5th flag would be set around 115 to 120 yards. The last, 6th flag would be set around 150 to 160 yards. Elevation: The flag closest to the target would be set just under the target. Then I would set each flag lower than the previous as we worked back to the bench. I would set them low enough to see a space between each flag. The above setup is the "ideal" setup that I would like to set the flags at. Not all ranges are flat. They are often built on sides of hills. Flag elevation could be from a foot off the ground to 25 feet high. Elevation and side off-set are adjusted for the terrain circumstances to enable the best view of the entire row of flags. The "flag setter" will use a bubble level to ensure the flag pole is vertical (level). I use a scope on a block setup to simulate a gun on a rest. This is much easier to use than moving an entire rest, rear bag and gun to each bench to set flags with.

#### **Jack Neary**

I volunteer as I am very, very picky about how flags should be set. My strategy in setting flags is to set the far flag directly in the middle of the target frame and work a straight line of flags off of the left corner of my front rest. This provides only a very slight angle, which I feel is best to view both let-toright and right-to-left wind conditions. I see many people set a big angle from the far flag over to the corner of the left bench. This large angle is fine during left-to-right conditions, but when you are trying to shoot a rightto-left wind condition, you cannot see the tails left near as well as a much straighter angle of flags. I like to set my first flag at about 12-15 yards in front of my bench. I firmly believe the first flag is very, very important, if it's blowing hard or reversed, your bullet will be pushed off its proper flight

path and will not come back! I have witnessed way too many shooters over the years discount the front flag time after time and lose shots and not understand what caused this? Additionally, I pay close attention to the nuances of each range for cut-outs in trees or barriers where wind has a higher disruption value than normal. Not all flags at all ranges have the same wind impact value and can vary greatly from range to range. I also like my far flag to be at 85 yards for shooting at 100 yds

Question 2) What do you use for tails. Do you hang them from the top or bottom of the flag and why? How long do you make them?

#### The Author

I've fooled with multiple types of tail materials. I started with the wide 2" surveyor's tape in bright orange. then went to 7/8" grosgrain ribbon in white or orange. I personally like the ribbon because it doesn't tangle, it handles the strong winds better, and you can use it multiple times without wrinkles. However, others don't care for the ribbon when conditions are light. So now for all Nationals I use 1-3/16" Presco PresGlo Arctic Roll Flagging Tape in Neon Orange. This tape is a little more expensive, but it's thicker than the typical surveyor's tape and it hangs great. I hang the tails from the top of the flag to just above the grass/ground. Longer tails are great when it's windy, but you don't want to tail dragging on the ground and preventing the flag from turning under light condition (like we typically see in the mornings). Another issue with longer tails, especially at 200-yards, is that they sometimes can interfere with the competitor next to you. I've shot next to a bench where the tails fly into view while I'm looking through the scope. How would you like to hit the flag tail of your neighbor's and put a bullet 2" away? When I see the potential of this happening, I will ask for the tail be shortened.

#### **Harley Baker**

The tail material I use is heavy weight white or blaze orange surveyor's ribbon. I put it in the top hole of the flag.


This allows me to get a slightly longer tail on a short pole range. I have tried bottom and top placement to see if it stops the tails from ending up in the props and I could never see any advantage. If it is going to be a windy switch day or a major match, I will have my tail material pulled through the top hole to where it cannot tangle in the prop and the other end its normal length. That way if the long end does get caught in the prop, I still have about a two-foot tail hanging there to help. I do not like to use those extremely long tails because I think they slow down the reactions of the paddles. **Bob Hamister** 


Tails: most of the time I use a heavy surveyor's tape in fluorescent orange. On occasion, I would use a fluorescent orange fabric ribbon, which is heavier than the surveyor's tape. I would use this tape when I know the winds are going to be high. I try to make all of the tails the same length (approximately 4 feet), when possible. I normally hang the tails from the top of the flag. I can see the tail

#### **Jack Neary**

I use standard surveyor ribbon flag tails most of the time, particularly in light summer wind conditions. I have also used gross-grain neon orange silk flag tails when it's windy or raining, as the gross-grain flag tail material does not get caught in the daisy wheel anywhere near as easy as surveyor ribbon tails

I normally will set the length of my flag tails to touch the ground. I may make the flag tails shorter if there are a lot of taller weeds around the flag stand. When setting flag tails on tall flag stands (>8 feet) I will use a length that is about 6 foot long.





Question 3) We obviously don't set five rows of flags by ourselves (although sometimes it may be faster, LOL). If someone offers to help you, what are the key thing they need to learn/do; where to stand, setting the poles, raising/lowering flags, etc.?

#### The Author

I love to have at least 4-6 helpers to set the flags. I come to Nationals with 4 fully charged walkie-talkies each set to the same channel (hopefully different than the other flag sponsors). I provide one walkie-talkie to each pair of helpers. I ask one pair of helpers to go down range to set up the furthest flags and the other pair(s) to set up mid-range and front set of flags. The key for all flag helpers/setters is to remember to stand to the left or right of the straight line made by the stands/flags from the target to the bench so they don't accidently block my view. Also, do not to go too far away from that line so you don't interfere with the flag setters on the benches to the right or left. When I need a stand moved to line it up, I always say, "move it to the big (or small) numbers" (referring to the range's target/bench numbers) rather move it right or left. This way there is no confusion in regard to who's right or left I'm referring to. The flag setters need to just remember to move stands "slowly" while holding the pole straight up and down. When it's right, I'll say, "plant it". It's important for the setter to try to hammer the stand in the ground straight without any tilting. Benchrite Shooting Accessories has a handy Flag Stand Leveler that works great for this! Lastly, make sure you tighten all the set-screws on the stand when done. No body wants the flag to drop after the first target.

#### **Harley Baker**

Please don't stand between the bench and the target, stand off to the side. When you are in the field learn what "to the small numbers or to the big numbers mean". Hold the pole plumb, this gets very hard when you

have very tall poles but practice makes perfect. Raise the flags from the bottom bigger poles and lower them from the top smaller poles. Do not take a hammer to the bottom plate and hammer it into hard ground, either have a spike or drill to put your pilot hole in with. Please use walkietalkies to communicate. Cell phones are great but some of the ranges do not have good coverage. Don't yell across the range especially to the guys at 150 yards. If you are the person behind the rifle or spotting scope remember the guys in the field are trying their best, be on time between benches and they don't have to be perfect. If someone was nice enough to invest in a full rotation of flags and poles please help them pick up after the match and return them to a desired location. Be careful when picking them up because a lot of them look the same. I try to have all my pole with the same color of tape so they are easy to keep together.

#### **Bob Hamister**

Helpers need to pay attention to the director (not converse with others). For setting flags at 100 yards, I prefer to have one person to actually place and adjust each flag. I use walkie talkies or cell phone to converse with the "flag setter". After each flag is set, the helper assigned to that flag would hold the flag, so the "orange" side of the flag is facing the bench. This way I can see the flag stagger and elevation clearly from the bench.

#### **Jack Neary**

I prefer to have my flag-setters stand on the right side of the flag stands and also.... have a good sense of what a "plumb" flag stand should be. Many times, inexperienced flag setters start pounding a flag stand into the ground very crooked and when they straighten the flag stand, the flag top is way out of alignment with the other flags.

Question 4) At other matches, what are biggest mistakes you see individual shooters do when setting their own flags?

#### The Author

I don't want to say my process is the best, but in general I just don't understand how some people can shoot well when all the flags are set up in a straight line "at the same height". To me it's confusing to have your 40-yard flag blocking you 60 and 80 flags. Other mistakes I've seen is when the flags are set too high or outside the lane. Remember the rules state, "flags are to be placed no higher than level of bench top to bottom of the target card. Furthermore, the competitor is to restrict the position of flags to within his competitive shooting lane. A shooting lane is defined as the centerlines between benches to the center-lines between target cards unique to each competitor". I know some shooters think it's not bothering anyone if their flags are high on their bench, but it may when someone is trying to watch the range to the left or right of their own bench. When I'm a referee I check the flag set up before the match starts to make sure now one is in violation of the rules. Lastly, flag stands that are tilting in one direction or the other are not going to allow the flag to move freely (bad for shooting good groups and easy to correct when setting).

#### **Harley Baker**

Don't be different." I hear that I can focus on my flags better". BIG MISTAKE. Don't reverse colors. You should see orange when the flag is pointing to the right, and green when it's pointing to the left.

#### **Bob Hamister**

At other matches, I see the following mistakes made (that is in my opinion).

- All of the flags are set at the same elevation.
- Tails too long (then they are too easy to tie up on a windy, switchy day).
- Flagpole is not vertical level.
- Flags are not balanced.
- If daisies are used, the daisies are not balanced.

#### **Jack Neary**

I personally don't understand why shooters make all of their flag heights the same exact height to where they cannot see any angle changes to their 4/60/80 middle flags? I believe this definitely hurts the shooter's ability to read condition changes on their given flag rotation. I really believe shooters/flag setters would be much further ahead if they were to stairstep the heights of their flags down 1 flag height, working back to the bench from the tallest flag down to the front flag which will, in many cases, be the shortest flag.

### Bench Rest Seminar - Harley Baker

On April 17-18 2021 Bob White and I had our 15th annual Benchrest seminar and clinic. We had 22 students attend. They varied in Benchrest knowledge from having shot some type of competition to the basic plinker that wanted to see what Benchrest was all about. On Saturday we started with the classroom portion and during the next 6 hours we took turns talking about different aspects of our sport. Bob starts with the basic history and different guns that we shoot and with over 55 years of Benchrest competition who else could explain it better. At this time he explained the different types of competition from group, score, hunter, 600yard and 1000 yard. I was up next and I talked about bench setup and the different styles from knob turning, bag squeezing, free recoil or holding the rifle. I had the front rests setup including my Farley to my Sinclair. I went on to explain shooting styles from picking to running and the reason for both. During the day we took several breaks and had plenty of time to answer any questions.

Bob took over and explained the targets we shoot and how to manage your target. This covered, if your first shot

doesn't hit where you expect it, using your sighter target before or during your record target time, Creedmore for score targets and noticing if your lost shots happen on the same score target or 5th shot. I was up next to explain reloading for Benchrest competition that always starts with SAFETY. There is a lot you can talk about in this section but I tried to touch on the basics of prepping brass, the three things we can do to TUNE our rifles with neck tension, bullet seating depth or powder charge. I talked about the tools needed to make quality hand loads and their care.

Bob explained Tuners and some of the myths that are out there. Rimfire tuners and their history and centerfire rifles and how he sees them. Two of the points that was covered was the "set it and forget it" and the "adjust it as you see how the group forms method". I had the task of trying to explain wind reading, flags and mirage effect on the bullet. It is very hard to convince a novice that the wind can actually move a bullet 1" at 100 yards. Some of the points I covered was how a bullet moves with a R to L vs L to R, different mirage conditions, types of flags and tail materials

and flag placement on the range.

Bob finished the day with some information on ranges, locations and matches that are on the schedule for this year. He also talked about some great reading materials and books that are available.

We were done with the class-room section and got the shooters ready for the next day of actual shooting. The shooters could choose from score or group at 100yards with two targets each. They could bring their own rifles or one of the coaches could supply them with a rifle. If they bring their own please make sure it is in good working order and zeroed for 100 yards.

## Interview with Lester Bruno: 2021 Cactus Classic Heavy Varmint and 2-Gun Champion By Gary Ocock

Lester started shooting benchrest in 1974, mostly at that time in the IBS organization back east.

He shot his way into the Short Range Benchrest Hall of Fame in 1985. In my opinion, Lester is one of the top 5 benchrest shooters of all time.

For many years Lester would bring benchrest items to the matches to sell. This led to him now owning a very successful business; Bruno's Shooters Supply located in Phoenix Arizona.

I know Lester since he started in 74 and have traveled with him all over the United States attending Benchrest matches. There is way too much to put into an interview about that so I'll try and keep it to the 2021 Cactus match.

Les said that during practice for the Cactus match he could tell the barrel he was shooting was a good one, as he could shoot good groups is lousy conditions. Conditions for the days of practice were breezy/windy and cold. Loads used for the match were 29.65 of VV133 for 100 yards and 29.75 for 200 yards. Why the change for 200. Les felt that the groups weren't as good as he thought they should be so he increased the charge and saw an improvement.

I asked about match strategy. He said that he doesn't shoot for little groups, he will look at the match targets and look for what the competitors are shooting; he then forms a plan on what he feels is acceptable for him given his experience and success. Sounds like what he's saying is; if there are good groups on the wailing wall, he knows he needs to go for it, and lousy groups he needs to be careful and avoid the mistake. Lester considers him self a 200 yard shooter

and I'd agree with him. We know most of the time grands and 2-gun matches are won at the 200 yard stages. Because I wasn't shooting very well this Cactus I ended up shooting my groups early in the match and then I would swing over and watch Les shoot his group. I can say not only did he shoot great on the record target but many times I saw him put shots on top of each other on the sighter target as well. It was clear that Lester was one of the shooters that would be hard to beat this weekend.

For many years Lester shot what we would call holding on and/or bag squeezing. He switched from his own Bruno pattern McMillan stock to the stock made by Bob Scarbrough. Bob's stock is what I will call a low profile. Les said; that Scarbrough stock allows him no matter whether he's holding on or shooting semi-free recoil to get better consistent good results. He feels the stock returns to battery better than any stock he's ever used, thus saving gun handling time and energy going back to target. Front rest is a SEB and the rear bag is a Bruno with tall ears. Sand bad fill is important, firm with some ability to compress.

Load data. Neck tension is medium, maybe .002 expansion when the bullet seats. He generally shoots on the hot side with powder charges, whether it's 10X or VV133. He shoots his own bullets. Bullet seating was just slightly off the lands, however he will test before the match and during the match as well. This match however he didn't test as he had so much confidence from his practice sessions, but he did change powder charge for the 200. It was a gut call as he saw a shot he didn't like on one target.

Les was trying to shoot a tail winds or let up's with one group going a cross wind. He also tries to shoot close to where he holds. He said that he held many shots because the gun was shooting so well.

Lester's recommendations for newer shooters and guys that are trying to better their results. Get comfortable and master their shooting style. He also feels that a slightly heavier trigger pull is more consistent (better results over time) and nothing beats a bunch of trigger time in all conditions.



#### Bench Rest Seminar - Harley Baker - Continued

Sunday we had 10 shooters on the line. A couple of our coaches and I set up some wind flags and wind probes. We had our safety meeting and sequence of calling the line. The rifles that were shot included 22 Rimfire to 308s. As the shooting was going on the coaches talked to and guided the shooters to help them with conditions and flag reading. After the shooting we went to the club house to hand out trophies and awards.

This seminar that we put on is because both Bob and myself love the sport of Benchrest and want it to grow. These seminars are not a major production costing a lot of money or time but do need someone to handle the preparations and the "little" things that need to be done, Bob White of Shooters Corner does a great job of this. Any ranges and match directors can certainly put these things on. I am here to help in any way that I can, contact me.


