



YEAR END UNLIMITED 5 SHOT INVITATIONAL BEN AVERY PHOENIX 2021

Every year we have a 5 shot Unlimited match at Ben Avery, Phoenix Az. Very often we have a few shooters that shoot some really nice aggregates. This year it was a challenge as you'll see from the results. We had 22 shooters show up for the match thanks in part to Lou Murdica bringing three of his grand kids to participate. They've shot this match before so they're veterans at it. Leading the way among the grand kids was Isabella Gonzalez who shot 5th place at 100 yards Saturday afternoon; just behind Lester Bruno in 4th place and just in front of Gary Ocock in 6th place.

We had our usual 2 days prior to the match for practice. The shooting conditions were not the best for any serious testing; good practice for developing a patient shooting strategy. The temps ranged from the high 40's to near 70. Pretty much the same weather we had for the match. Saturday's weather – low of 44 to a high of 66. Max wind speed was 13 mph at noon and switching. Winning the first yardage of the weekend was Lester Bruno shooting a .2124 aggregate; this was after starting off the agg with a .363. Les finished the agg shooting his last 3 targets with nice low to mid one's. In second place was Earl Horgeshimer shooting a .2148. Earl took second by finishing his agg with a .117 in match #5. In third place was Joe Pipola with a .2222. Joe managed 3rd place via a .087 in match #3; that was also small group for the aggregate. Isabella was tops in this aggregate amongst the Grand kids finishing in 19th place.

Sat. afternoon we shot the 2nd 100 yard stage with our unlimited rifles. Shooting conditions remained about the same

except that in the morning's aggregate we had those early morning winds from the North off the mountain.

If you make a mistake with that condition you can get an ugly (big) group on your first target and ruin a potentially nice aggregate. The aggregates were typical for the day in the afternoon, pretty much the same as the last 4 targets in the am. aggregate. Winning the agg was Bob Brackney shooting a .1942. Bob didn't win any the matches but did shoot a nice .124 in match #2. In second place, close on Bob's heals was Brad Jensen shooting a .1944. Brad almost caught Bob shooting a .133 in match #5. In third place was Earl Horgeshimer shooting a .1962. Earl won the unofficial 100 yard day shooting a combined .2055 for both 100 yard aggs. Shooting small group for the vardage was Lester Bruno shooting a .110 in match #5. Isabella Gonzalez again finished best among the grand kids finishing in 5th place.

Sunday we shot the 200 yards stages of the match. Weather conditions were similar to the day before with the wind slightly more varying in direction and intensity. Temperatures were low of 46 and a high of 72 degrees. The wind did let up a bit in the afternoon just in time for the second 200 yard stage. Shooting well and winning the first 200 yard aggregate was Lester Bruno. Les shot a .1695 agg handily in front. He won 2 match's; shooting a .243 and .292 in matches #2 and #3. In second place was Gary Ocock with a .2039. In third place was Earl Horgeshimer shooting a .2203. Shooting the small group for the yardage was Jim Nicolas a .206 in match #5. Isabella did it again besting the other Murdica grand kids; she shot a .2611 witch included winning match #1 with a .358 group.

After a quick break we shot the 2nd 200 yard stage. Shooting conditions eased up a bit if you were patient and waited for a lull or a slight push in one direction. Les picked the right time to shoot and shot a very good .1367 agg. He also shot small group for the yardage a .133. He said that he held the last shot slightly without shooting a sighter as he saw the flags changing ever so slightly. It helps that he's one of the top short range group shooters in the world and has 40+ years of experience. In second place was Jack Childers shooting a .1596. Both Lester and Jack in my opinion beat the range with those aggs in the shooting conditions we faced. In third place was Texan Jim Nicolas with a .1952. We have a different grand kid besting the others with Angelina Gonzalez finishing in 15th place. Isabella would have given her a run for it but one bad group did her in.






How can the NBRSA assist you in making your matches more successful?

BARRELS & BULLETS

by | Joel Nader



Take a great shooting rifle and place it into a poorly adjusted front rest and ill-fitting rear sand bag and it will still be a great shooting rifle but you will struggle to shoot a five shot group with it in competition and your aggregates will suffer. That's why a good bench set up is top priority. Proper adjustment of tension knobs and keen attention to fill levels of front and rear sand bags is a big part of the accuracy equation.

Take a good rifle that will shoot a .2100 agg in good conditions off of a good bench set up. Replace your Jewell trigger with a Bix-N-Andy or a Flavio. You still have a .2100 rifle. You may prefer one type of trigger to another but as long as they all are functioning properly you won't see any significant accuracy gains by swapping them out. Replace your Kelbly fiberglass stock with a Scoville or Scarbrough carbon fiber stock. You still have a .2100 rifle. You may prefer one type of stock to another but you won't see any accuracy gains by changing stocks. Replace your Leupold or Weaver scope with a March or Nightforce. You still have a .2100 rifle. Now, each shooters vision is a little different and we all have a preference as to what scopes we like, what magnification, what type reticle. We will certainly shoot better with our preferred configuration but as long as all these scopes are holding point of impact there are no accuracy gains to be had just by swapping them out. Changing barrels and bullets, now that's a different story.

Move up to some really good bullets and your .2100 rifle will be magically transformed into an .1800 rifle. Try to shoot some bullets that aren't so good and your aggregates will skyrocket. This makes good bullets the #1 component **20** | Precision Rifleman | February 2022 Issue priority in Benchrest. That is why the majority of top competitors make their own. So, what makes really good bullets. Well, certainly the dies and punches are the main controlling factor and the jackets are also paramount to success. The press operator makes a big difference too, not everybody is well suited to this repetitive task. Outdoor competition is the bullet proving ground for BR shooters. We want a bullet that will cut conditions in the wind and the shooter plays a major role in that evaluation. Some of the best bullets I have made produced some nice small aggregates when my shooting and tune were right on for the range conditions on a given day. Same bullets, same rifle, different range, different day, just average aggregates.

Most barrels (80%) available today are really good in my opinion but you don't know until you chamber them up and run a ladder test with good bullets to see how they perform. Some (20%) won't consistently group with any combo of seating depth or powder charge. Others will look good with only one seating depth/powder charge. While a few will look good over a multiple seating depth/ powder charge range. You don't want to sit at the bench and burn up a potentially good barrel, so take it to a club match and see how it aggs. If you win, It's safe to say it's a good barrel. If the aggregate doesn't go well you can clean it up and try it again at another club match. If you can get it to shoot a teen aggregate it's ready for a major match.

I have 3 sporters for group shooting and will chamber up a new barrel for each one every year if need be. After the first 100 rounds or so a barrel's performance level is what it is, their characteristics

don't change. If I take a proven 1800 agg barrel and screw it on any of my other sporters it's still an .1800 agg barrel. If I take a .2300 agg barrel and screw it on another rifle it's still a .2300 agg barrel. With barrels and bullets you have good ones, not so good ones and unfortunately a few bad ones. Shoot average bullets in an average barrel and you're bound to have an average day. Put a good barrel together with good bullets and you'll be in the winner's circle.

Ignition, Ignition, Ignition...Little Things Mean A Lot!

As the start of Spring is still a couple of months away, now, during the cold months of winter, is an excellent time to take a close look at the heart of your rifles performance foundation, its fire-control assembly.

We all get very lax during the heat of shooting season, whereby we continue to shoot our BR rifles match after match after match without paying any attention to the maintenance of our rifle fire-controls and triggers. Proper adjustment and smooth operation are absolutely critical in ensuring your rifle may achieve its peak accuracy/shooting performance through addressing and correcting emerging ignition issues!

It is said, we only learn through our mistakes, and I am the first one to have learned some great lessons from some of the very best gunsmiths, regarding fixing my BR rifle's poor performance, due to my own fire control and trigger negligent maintenance throughout the match season from years past.

I have been extremely fortunate over the past 25 years to have been provided with a keen education on the importance of ignition through proper fire-control and trigger operational maintenance and red-flag issues...from a few of our games very best gunsmiths.

Beyond learning the key nuances of tuning your BR rifles, learning the many key ignition "red-flag" areas that will destroy the true performance of a BR rifle should be at the top of any shooters list of valued lessons learned...

When it Comes to Ignition...LittleThings Matter Very Much!

Until someone points-out a key adjustment/maintenance issue with your rifle's fire-control and/or trigger operation, you look at these items without really seeing the serious problem at hand which is solely affecting your rifles performance....We just don't know what we have not learned yet...

First, if you're currently using a BAT action, you need to try the following... While you have your complete firecontrol in your bolt, de-cock your fire-control to where you can measure your firing pin protrusion through your bolt-face. Brownells make a very useful firing pin protrusion gage that will make it easy for you to accurately measure the firing-pin protrusion on your bolt. (Part #080-782-000WB \$39.95)

The protrusion of your firing pin should be no less than .060". If, through your careful measurement, your firing pin protrusion is less than .060", please consult your qualified BR gunsmith for this to be corrected asap! Shallow firing pin protrusion will lead to erratic ignition and a poor shooting BR rifle!

While your fire control is in the fired position, look at the cocking piece to see if it is bottoming-out at the bottom of the cocking ramp of your bolt? You should see a small amount of clearance between the bottom of your cocking piece and the base of your cocking ramp of your bolt. If the cocking piece is bottoming-out at the base of the cocking ramp, it may cause reduced firing-pin protrusion and vibration issues at ignition.

Next, re-cock your bolt and remove your fire-control from your bolt. Grab the shroud in your left-hand and hold the bushing behind the tip of your firing pin and see if the firing pin is loose, where it can be turned either way. I will bet many of your firing pins will be somewhat loose as it will turn freely in your hand as you try and turn it! This is bad Ju-Ju, as a loose firing pin will have a negative effect on your rifles consistent ignition and result in poor shooting performance!

If you have a loose firing pin, now is a great time to completely dissemble your fire-control so you can further inspect the cocking piece very closely for any galling on its sides or...also inside the shroud.

Before un-screwing the firing pin from the cocking-piece, BAT recommends measuring the distance from the outside of the back of the shroud to the rear-tip of the firing pin and recording that length so you may use that length when you re-assemble the fire-control. I would respectfully caution you, that while it's

important to record this length, you must be careful that if your firing pin has been backing-out (un-screwing) from the cocking piece while you have been shooting your rifle for months (or years), this length you are measuring and recording may be the wrong length to use to use to re-assemble your firing pin to.

Using a 1/16" Hex Driver tool, available at Amazon or at better hobby shops (avoid using allen wrenches as the ball-ends of allen wrenches will easily round off and strip out small set-screws) and remove both of the 2 set-screws from the cocking-piece of your fire-control. Carefully unscrew the firing pin from the threaded cocking-piece. It's very important to note, to not use your favorite channel-lock pliers to unscrew the firing pin from the cocking piece. BAT recommends using a cordless screwdriver to unscrew the firing pin from the cocking piece. (Please check out their "how-to" videos on their website) Be very careful not to scratch any part of the bushing or tip of your beloved firing pin during this process for obvious reasons.

Galling marks on the sides of your cocking-piece or on the inside of your shroud will quickly reveal cocking-piece dragging (ignition!) issues, which is a MAJOR problem and will severely ruin your rifles peak accuracy performance at a minimum!

Should you see some galling on the sides of your cocking piece or on inside the shroud, you will want to identify what is the cause of this galling? It could be simply caused by grit build-up inside the shroud, but, it is most likely being caused from a too-tight fit of the cocking piece inside the shroud.

Depending on your skill-level, (This is also a very good time to call your well-qualified BR gunsmith for his expertise and assistance) you may wish to use a 2000 grit sandpaper to carefully remove the raised galled area on the side(s) of your cocking piece and carefully repolish the sides and re-insert the cocking-piece inside the shroud and test the fit by shaking it to gage its proper fit with adequate clearance without any binding. Patience and perseverance

is required here, as you will most likely need to sand and re-polish a number of times to where your cocking piece becomes adequately free and smooth (but not overly loose!)

While you have your fire-control completely disassembled, please take the time to inspect the ends of your firing pin spring to ensure they are smooth. Many times, if the ends of your firing pin springs are rough, they will "grab" on the back side of your firing bushing and front of your shroud to were they increase in binding resulting in more difficult bolt-lift! It the ends of your firing pin springs are very rough, take time to smooth the ends by carefully chucking-up the spring in a drill and use fine sandpaper to polish the end surfaces of your firing pin springs.

During the reassembly of your firing pin (assuming you are doing your own work) using a flashlight, with both set-screws removed from your cocking piece of your fire-control (Note: Newer BAT rifles have a single longer set-screw), look into the threaded-hole where your setscrew is used and you will see a very short <u>non-threaded</u> flat section on the back of your firing pin where your setscrew should be contacting. Chances are, with your loose firing pin has now unscrewed moved to where your set-screw in the cocking piece is no longer contacting this very small flat-section of your firing pin. Carefully apply a very small touch of blue Lock-Tite to both set-screws and re-insert them into the cocking piece while making sure the firing pin is properly screw-in to where the set screws contact the small flat non-threaded area of the firing pin.

On a separate note, if you have ever dropped your firing pin on a hard floor, etc...do not try and straighten it...Replace it! Your bent firing pin, that was subsequently straighten, will retain its bent memory resulting in undesirable firing pin dragging, effecting your rifles shooting performance!

It's my hope these maintenance tips and suggestions will certainly help return your rifle to its former glory of a top shooting rifle!


