Due to the Covid-19 crisis, the WBC-16 committee decided to move the April 2021 competition date to September 2021 in hopes of being able to have the competition. It was scheduled to be held in Capetown, South Africa. In December of 2020 a final decision was made by the World Benchrest Shooting Federal to cancel the 2021 World Benchrest Championship.

Deep regrets go to each member as they worked very hard at earning a position on this team. As a small token, the top 12 shooters were awarded a "team jacket" that was sponsored by Bartlein Barrels. A big thank you to Tracy Bartlein and Bartlein Barrels.

As far as we know the next World Team competition will be held in Capetown, South Africa in 2023. Qualifying matches for the 2023 team will be held in 2022. A list of the ranges that will host the qualifying matches was set at the 2021 Annual Board of Directors meeting in September. The ranges that have set their dates are listed below. After the rest of the ranges set their dates for the qualifying matches we will post them in future copies of the magazine and on the website.

2022 Rules and Qualifying Matches for WBC-16

The US World Team qualifying matches for WBC-16 to be held in Cape Town South Africa in 2023 are listed below. Dates will be posted on the website and upcoming magazines as they are provided.

- 1. Cactus Classic Phoenix, AZ — March 12-13, 2022
- 2. Shamrock, Dublin, GA — March 26-27, 2022
- 3. Hog Roast Fairchance, PA
- 4. East / West St. Louis, MO — June 25-26, 2022
- 5. Rattlesnake Raton, NM
- 6. NBRSA Nationals St. Louis, MO – October 10-15, 2022

The point system for the qualifying matches above was voted on by the NBRSA Board of Directors and is as follows:

For matches 1 thru 5 each competitor will be awarded one (1) point for each competitor he/she beats in the LV and HV Grands up to a maximum of seventy (70) points per grand in matches having at least seventy one (71) competitors. Competitors finishing below 70th place will receive zero (0) points. Should a match have fewer than seventy one(71) competitors the actual amount of competitors beaten will be used as the maximum points awarded. The competitors LV and HV grand point totals will be added together to establish their awarded points for that match.

For the NBRSA Nationals each competitor will be awarded one (1) point for each competitor he/she beats in the LV and HV grands regardless of the number of competitors. There are no point restrictions for this match! The competitors LV and HV Grand point totals will be added together to establish their awarded points for the match. In all qualifying matches the number of competitors in each grand shall be determined by the largest quantity of shooters to shoot at least one (1) group in either yardage of that class. The logic used here is not to take points away from any competitor because shooters begin a yardage and do not complete it for whatever reason. I/E The 2008 Cactus where many shooters began the 200 yard classes on Sunday afternoon but with 30-40 mph winds dropped out significantly reducing the formal grand totals. Final qualifying point totals will be established by using each competitors best three (3) of six (6) qualifying match totals. Based on this system attendance at the NBRSA Nationals will be almost imperative. Please contact me if you need further information.

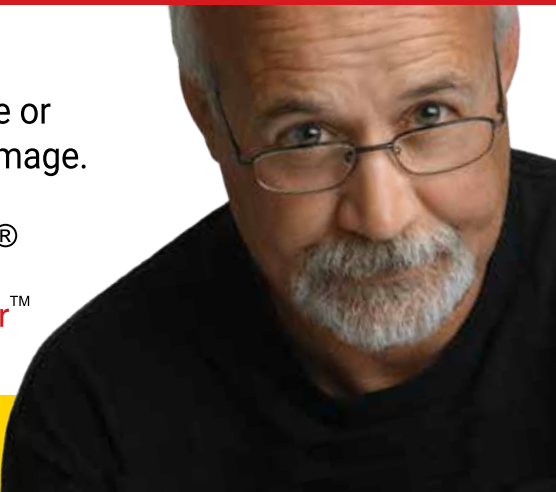

Results Received: 11/20/2021

Twenty-one shooters arrived for the annual event held in Sidney Ohio. They were greeted by early morning showers followed by cloudy skies on Saturday and a beautiful sunny day on Sunday. The temperatures were between the low 40's to mid- 60's with a 10-20 mph breeze both days. The leaves were turning gold and crimson. The range was in great ship. It was Fall in Southern Ohio.

Vic Potts set the pace by winning the 100 yd Light Varmint by shooting a .1608 agg. Jack Neary placed second with a .1692 and Bob Hawkins finished third with a .2100. Small group for the yardage belonged with Jack Neary who shot a .074.

After lunch, Jack Neary finished the 100 yd Heavy Varmint competition with a blistering .1470 aggregate followed by Lacy Tilly with a .1720. Paul Whit claimed third place by shooting a .1970. Vic Pott's .093 clenched the small group honor.

joyed a pulled pork dinner complete with homemade sides and desserts. All attending really enjoyed themselves's and no one went away hungry. Vic Potts made it look easy by shooting a .1799 for the 200 yd Heavy Varmint. Jack Neary shot a .2440 for second while Tim Humphreys came in third with a .2584. Small group honors belonged to Vic Potts with a .184.

After a great lunch, Jack Neary worked some of it off by firing a .3279 and winning the 200 yd Light Varmint. Ted Heindselman was nearby shooting a .3314 for second place. Williams Symons claimed third place with a .3610 and small group of .358.

Top honors for the 2-gun event went to Jack Neary who finished the week-end with a .2220 aggregate. Vic Potts placed send with a .2275 and Harley Baker took third with a .2738.

This was our inaugural NBRSA 600 yard match held at Upper Nisqually Sportsman's Club (UNSC) - located in Eatonville, WA – located about 50 miles west of Mount Rainier.

The last time UNSC hosted a NBRSA registered match - well it was so long ago, no one really remembers exactly when. Maybe 15 years ago? Back in the day - matches were shot at 600 and 1000 yards. Today, UNSC no longer has a 1000 yard range and matches are limited to 600 yards.

We had 15 shooters attending this inaugural match - with several traveling from Oregon - thanks for making the trek up for this match!

Weather can be stormy this time of year - but we caught a nice break between record breaking rainstorms that have caused a lot of local flooding. Cloudy skies to start, chilly 31 degrees, clear crisp air, calm to light winds for most of the morning, with the sun finally breaking out to warm temperatures to the high 40's by noon.

The 6mm cartridges based on the 6BR Norma case tend to be the predominant cartridge shot for long range benchrest in both Light Gun (LG) and Heavy Gun (HG). Lately, there is a slight shift/trend toward having a larger caliber chambered up for Heavy Gun class - especially when conditions are 'windy'. Certain ranges where it is known to be windy - you will see the equipment list dominated with larger caliber cartridges. The common windy day HG chambering seen on the line is usually some form of a 30 caliber

When Should I Start My Group?

A very popular and age-old question in Benchrest Group shooting is... "When should I start my group?"

When I first started shooting Benchrest and lacked experience many years ago, I was very cavalier about what wind condition direction and intensity should I chose to start my group? My feeling was that the first shot is "free" and I only needed to worry about placing the last 4 shots in the first bullet hole?

Alas...I very quickly learned that strategy was very flawed, if you are indeed trying to shoot your best groups and aggregates.

I painfully learned, particularly when shooting 100yd aggregates, that putting my first-shot on the record target without a keen awareness of the prevalent or dominant wind angles and intensity conditions would leave me many times with having to make unnecessary holds in reverse wind-angle conditions. I soon realized I was really placing myself behind the proverbial 8-ball, in a major way, by trying to place my second shot in a much different wind angle or intensity condition into my first shot on record.

At best, early on, I may have hit a part on the first bullet-hole on my second-shot, creating a mid-two tenths group with three more shots to go! Yikes! I was determined to learn a better or the best way to start my groups...

I quickly abandoned my "first shot is free" strategy as it became very apparent even with my improving wind reading skill-set, shooting small CONSISTENT groups that yield small aggregates would require my first-shot on my record targets to hit a point-of-impact that was where I expected it to be, ensuring that my remaining shots on record should hit very close to my first shot, predicated on my rifle being in-tune. Now I really felt I was on the right path!

A little rifle tuning background Information... As my flag/condition reading skills slowly improved, through lots of practice and lots of match failures...

I had a major "Aah-Ha" breakthrough moment! I learned if my rifle was "out-of-tune", my first shot point-of-impact would not go where it should in that given wind angle and intensity condition.

I began to learn, if my load was "too light" my first shot on my sighter (or record) target would move laterally too far right or left with the given cross-wind intensity or... the shot would have way too much of a vertical point-of-impact shift up (in right-to-left) or down (in left-to-right) wind conditions.

On the other spectrum, if my load was too hot, I began to see a pattern where one of my sighter/record shots would either, back-up into the given wind condition or have a "point-of-impact" that would be print

lower on the target. This is especially very true with VV N133 powder at 100yds. (Other powders will have a pattern that will generate an odd point-of-impact that makes no sense in that given wind angle/condition with loads that are too hot)

Although painful, I was learning very, very useful new skills, where I could quickly tell if my "load" was too hot or too cold or if my seating depth was just not right. Lastly, as a major advancement in my rifle tuning skills, I began to see the small but extremely important differences in the size and shape of my bullet holes on my sighter or record target... For me, this was very exciting in learning to tune my BR rifles by thoroughly drilling-down and studying these very small tuning clues that simply go un-noticed unless you really start studying your practice or match

targets or till someone points them out to you. After closely reviewing each of my 100 yard targets after the end of one of our NBRSA Eastern Region group matches, I began to notice when my rifle was "in-tune" the bullet holes/groups were distinctly round and the edges of the groups were cut very cleanly with no tears in the target paper!

When my loads were too light, this was very easy to diagnose, as I could quickly tell, based upon the larger bullet holes on both the 100yd and 200yd targets. When a single-bullet hole appears to touch two-rings (at 100yards), the bullet has too much yaw/pitch to its rotation and is moving too slow to create the smaller (not the smallest) bullet diameter hole in the target paper. When you see one-shot touching two-rings at 100 yards, you need not need to waste a second tuning shot....

When the loads were too-hot, the bullet holes were smaller and would find a reason not to go into the group, as I could see the radiuses of each of the 5-shots.

When the seating depth was not right, this would generate a bullet hole that would either have a elliptical shape with 2/3 of the bullet hole having a distinct black powder "edge" on the radius of the bullet hole, the remaining 1/3 of the bullet hole would have no powder edge and... will almost always show a paper tear.

You also will very easily see when your seating depth is off is when your bullet holes actually look "square" or the bullet holes look like a Torx screwdriver was pushed through the target, where the bullet hole has "splines" around the inside edges of the bullet hole in the target.

As my rifle tuning skills slowly began to improve, I began to more accurately develop the ability to call-my-shot, where if the first-shot, on record, in a given condition, was not where I confidently knew the second shot would not hit, due to either an out-of-tune load, gun-handling or bag set-up issue, I would chase my first-shot with increased high-level of confidence.

One of the worst mistakes a shooter can make, is to assume when the first shot does not achieve the expected point-of-impact on your record target, which your sighter(s) have indicated, is to hope your second shot will hit the first shot. This will very rarely happen. In this case, without any hesitation, don't go to the sighter! "Chase" your second shot by holding towards where you need to in order to hit your first shot. When you have to chase your first-shot on record, a red-flag should go off in your head that your load, gun handling, bag set-up is not quite right and needs to be corrected asap. Ideally, when your first record shot hits where it is expected, you can make minor hold-changes, if necessary, due to condition changes, allowing you to finish your group. This, admittedly, can be easier said than done, when conditions will not hold-steady in a given wind/angle direction for little more than a few seconds.

As these rifle tuning factors will tie-in directly to when to start your group,

as should try and learn the morning of a given match-day what the expected wind conditions (direction angles and velocities) will be from paying close attention to the weather forecast and wind conditions when you arrive at the range in the morning... You will note, at larger matches, most of the top shooters in our game will make an effort to watch the relay, prior to their relay, to gain a keen understanding of what the dominant wind angle conditions have been or will be most prevalent for that given aggregate.

Beware of Lunch time.... Many, many, times the wind angle and mild condition you that you enjoyed and shot well during the morning aggregate will change after the lunch break for the afternoon aggregate. The better shooters in our game are thinking ahead and are prepared for wind angle changes or wind increases that will require you to increase your respective loads to match the stiffer winds that will generally occur during the afternoon aggregates...

When you first sit down at the bench for your first match of an aggregate, if you

did not have a chance to observe what the dominant wind range conditions were during the relay before yours, due to smaller matches with only two relays, you must immediately pay close attention to what the dominant wind conditions are while you are setting up your front rest, etc...Again, knowing your favorite right-to-left condition that you shot during the morning aggregate has now disappeared with the changing afternoon wind conditions is smart awareness, where you must quickly adapt to the new left-to-right conditions that greet you for the start of the afternoon LV/HV/ Sporter or Unlimited aggregate.

Should the wind conditions be really challenging with strong gusts and reverses, you will need to identify if there is a wind angle that will repeat or a let-up in the wind intensity, where you could get your 5-shots down range quickly with or without holding for the wind intensity or wind angle changes.

You may be more comfortable, should the wind changes be very abrupt, to where running your group could easily

produce a much larger group than perhaps choosing to pick through the conditions. Some shooters are "pickers" and some shooters are more comfortable "running" their groups... The top shooters in our game will try and finish their groups once they start, by making hold corrections for the wind changes.

Should you be a "picker" and the wind conditions for that aggregate showing they are pretty difficult, and you recognize the need to pick through your group, it's important to start your group as early as possible to ensure you will have enough time to complete your respective group. Whatever type of shooter you might be, during windy conditions, your goal should be to start your group by waiting for the wind intensity to be at its softest point when you start your group. You may recognize the softest "let-up" condition by keenly studying the sides of the range where the dominant winds are coming from, by looking for flag-tails dropping and also watching the speed of daisy wheels slowing down, particularly at the dominant flag area of a given range. Every range I have shot always

has 2-3 key flags at 100 or 200 yards that may have the greatest impact on moving your bullet.

To that end, when I arrive at range that I have never shot before or to a range where I have not shot at very frequently, I will practice while only watching 1 or 2 specific flags (in a given dominant condition) to see what yardage flags are the most important! Should I lose shots out of my group by only watching 1 or 2 non-bearing yardage flags, I will reset my flag focus to pay much more attention to other yardage flags that may be the dominant flags that have the most influence on that range. This exercise on a Thursday or Friday practice day before the start of a weekend 2-Gun match, I believe is one of the best practices a shooter can do to ensure their success at a range where they have little familiarity or.... a range where you have struggled with very little success at previous matches...

Should you not be concentrating on starting your group at the softest condition and develop flag "tunnel-vision" and you start your group, we'll say during your 200yd aggregate, your first shot

may then hit out between the 8-ring and 7-ring area on the record target, you'll have your hands-full in trying to hit your first shot with follow-up multiple cross-wind intensity changes; where you may shoot a shot in a harder pick-up, placing your 2nd shot near the 6-ring and on your 3rd shot the wind lets-up and now you have a shot near the 8 or 9-ring. Ouch.

A better strategy is choosing to start your group by keenly watching and waiting for the weakest wind intensity to come to the left or right of YOUR bench, succinctly before you place your first shot on your record target, which should hit near the edge of the moth-ball. Now... the only thing you need to worry about, is for the wind pick-up (assuming to do not get caught in reverse). By following this strategy, you will take the possibility of shooting in a let-up out of the equation, preventing shots from sucking back close to the moth-ball. Please give it a try in practice! Eliminating large flat-groups at 200yds during a match can really be achieved by paying close attention to ensure you're getting started in the softest condition!

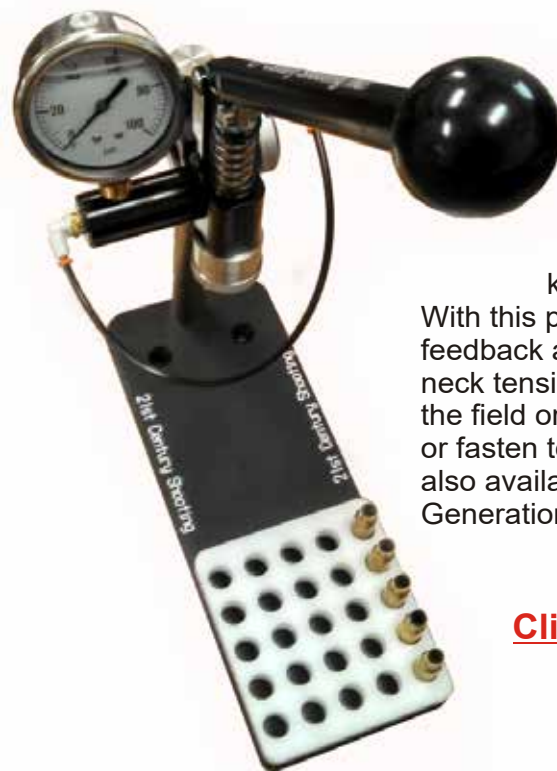

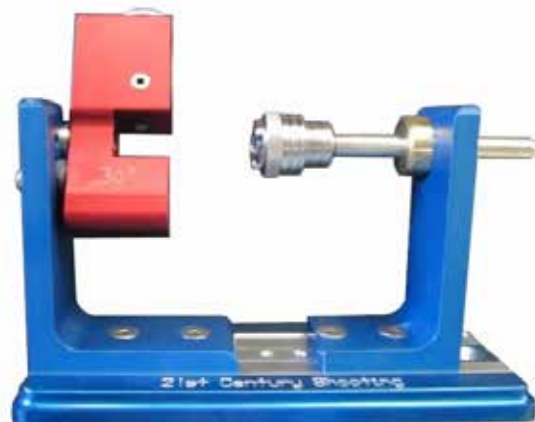
