We have changed our Screamer Patch Program to a Screamer Sticker Program. Please see the details below on how you can earn your stickers.

NBRSA Screamer Sticker

The screamer sticker is awarded to members for exceptional groups shot in competition. Your group must be fired in a registered NBRSA match with a moving backer. The backer requirement is removed for 600 & 1000 yard matches only. There is not a limit as to how many stickers a competitor can earn. The screamer sticker criteria is as follows:

Long Range Group Benchrest

600 Yards: 5-shot 0.99" - 10-shot 1.99"

1000 Yards: 5-shot 2.99" - 10-shot 4.99"

600 Yards: 5-shot 148 - 5x - 10-shot 293 - 8x

Middle Georgia Gun Owner's Association in Dublin Georgia hosted the 21st Annual Shamrock March 26-27, 2022. As usual Matt Owens, Stump and the entire MGGOA crew ran a flawless shoot.

In the spring, Dublin always delivers "sporty" conditions, but this year was especially challenging. Much of the time it was impossible to run even 2 shots, so picking was the way to go. The Southeast Region holds a 4 day 4 gun regional championship each fall. This year it will be held September 22-25 at the home of the Shamrock, MGGOA in Dublin Georgia. This will be a good warmup for the NBRSA Group Nationals in October so y'all come shoot!

Steve Lee encourage shooters that don't yet have a benchrest rifle but enjoy distance shooting to participate in some of our matches or our weekly practice sessions held every Monday except the Monday following our match.

As mentioned, our match this month was well attended and the weather didn't let us down. Throughout most of the match the temperature was in the mid 60's and reached 70 degrees by the end of the match. Of course the warm weather was accompanied by the wind and a mirage making bullet placement a little challenging, but nothing a little hold-over or a couple of minutes of adjustment on the scope couldn't handle.

The match ran smoothly, and by the completion of the match some familiar names stood out in the following categories.

Next up on Sunday was the Light Varmint 200. Shooting conditions became a bit trickier. I think the wind wasn't as strong but it was changing angles quickly and not holding very long. Since they raised the dirt berms on either side of the range we now experience different wind patterns within the same lane. It's not unusual to have a few flags in your lane going one direction and a few going in another. Throw in that you can get angle changes as well. It can be easy to lose a shot and ruin a nice competitive group. A case in point is Lester's 2nd target (LV 200) he had 4 shots in about a .400+ he said he had a brain fart and fired the last shot as the condition was changing. He ended up with a .820; not a complete train wreck but it pissed him off. He then proceeded to shoot two 3's and a high 4 for his last three targets thus winning the 200 Light Varmint aggregate. So by my count he fired 100 record rounds and only let one slip out carelessly. At the same time he fired a good number of rounds nearly perfect. It was an awesome performance for the weekend. Another example of the tricky conditions was with Jack Neary. Jack was shooting competitive for 3 targets (LV 200) shooting 2 fours and a six. This is our last match at Ben Avery – Phx. For the 21-22 winter-spring season. We shot the Unlimited Class 5-Shot all weekend. Some past years we've had some really nice shooting conditions thus shooting nice aggregates and some very small groups. This year wasn't one of them though. It seems that we've had a shooting season this year with very challenging shooting conditions; both for matches and practices as well.

The weather for the 2 days of practice and the match weekend was comfortable temperature wise but breezy, windy shooting wise. Temps ranged from high 60's to 90+. Winds ranged from 10 seconds of calm to 25mph. Most of the time the wind fluctuated from 5 mph to 25. The 5 mph stuff was when the wind was changing angles or completely switching direction. During practice and during the match I fired shots to see what the drift was. I had a few shots drift out close to 1.5 inches this at 100 yards. Lou Murdica had a target at 200 yards during practice; at one point he made the comment the push was near 4 inches. Conditions like this are good for practicing match competition, not so much for fine tuning your load. Not only did you have to manage the wind speed but as usual at Ben Avery we now have to watch closely the angle changes. Match attendance was way down; in my opinion there were several reasons for this and with none of those reasons is there an easy fix; it appears that, that's the way benchrest shooting is today.

We started the match about a half an hour early as the wind forecast wasn't very attractive as the day wore on. Bob Brackney took advantage of this by winning the first 2 matches with groups of .151 and .143. Ok groups but not great for 5 shots with a rail gun. Match 3 the wind picked up and from this point on you had to work at real hard to shoot a nice group. Paul (the primer) Weaver did it best in match #4 shooting small group for the yardage a .135. Winning the aggregate was Bud Mundy shooting a .2154; again not a very attractive agg with a rail however somewhat beating the range and besting the other competitors. Taking the small group shot for each match in this agg we have a .1538 aggregate. If you at the aggs shot in comparison to the best groups shot in each match, it gives us some form of reference. Bud's agg was .0616 larger than the best possible (small group each match), to be expected.

out to the right; wrong no shot out it was a nice oblong hole. Best guess is was a spot on his scope lens or a floater in his eye that made it look like a shot was out of the group. Tips and Tricks

with NBRSA President Jack Neary

Case Neck Expansion Timing

As our shooting season has or is about to kick-off in many of our NBRSA regions, and many (myself included) are in a rush to turn some new Lapua .220 Russian case necks. Please take a moment to review your neck-turning processes you have been following, perhaps for many years?

As an example, in your neck-turning case prep, if you first run all of your new cases through your FL die and then run them through your favorite expander mandrel, prior to turning your case-necks, you may want to hit the pause-button, prior to expanding ALL of your case-necks at one time.

By expanding all of your case-necks at one time, your last cases you neck-turn will mostly likely have a tighter fit on your neck-turn mandrel, resulting in case-necks that are becoming inconsistent or... thinner in thickness than the cases you turned earlier where there was a smaller window between the time when you expanded your case-necks and then started your neck-turning process, particularly if you are turning more than 20 or more cases at a time!

What is happening to cause this phenomenon of thinner case-neck thicknesses is that is your new case have their best elasticity when they are new and, as such, will spring-back quickly after you expand the neck of each of your new cases.

Moreover, if your process is to expand the necks of "all" of your new cases you are about to neck-turn at the same

time, the case-necks that have been sitting the longest, waiting to be neck-turned, will undoubtedly begin to spring-back to their original .22 size and become much more tight-fitting on the mandrel of your case neck-turner. Not good!

I would suggest, as an option to consider, to expand your .220 Russian case-necks, one-at-a-time, right before you are about to neck-turn each case to their final thickness. Over the years, I received a number of calls from BR shooters complaining they have each tried numerous brands of top-quality neck turners in an effort to turn more consist neck thicknesses. However, despite a few neck-turner brand changes, their case neck thicknesses still fluctuate in thickness for some reason?

Upon further review, the common thread is that many shooters have expanded all of their case-necks at one-time and then start neck-turning them over a several hour (or day...) period, where the case-necks have sprung-back from their .243" diameter to a much tighter fit on their neck-turner mandrel.

Making a small change in your process on "when" you actually expand your new case-necks, prior to their final neck-turning, will pay measurable and positive results!

The trip to Calgary was a Vacation for my wife Debbie, our grandson Gavin and myself. We had all sorts of fun stuff and sightseeing planned before, during and after the rifle match. We had beautiful weather for our scenic drive through Utah, Idaho and Montana. When we reached the border at Sweet Grass I needed to stop and fill out form 4457, to get my rifles back into the US on the return trip.

I was looking for the entrance to US Customs but missed it and drove straight into the Canadian check point. We were asked the standard set of questions and went inside to declare the rifles. Then I looped back into the US check point. The agent asked "How long have you been in Canada?" about 15min" I replied. I explained what happened and was told to park out back and check in at the desk. Inside there were quite a few cowboys with horse trailer issues so while I was waiting I looked around at the office wall that was full of pistol competition trophies and photos of the winners. One of the agents that was in one of the photos stepped up and got me squared away with the paperwork. He needed to verify the serial numbers on the rifles, so while walking back to the truck with me He asked

about the World Competition and the rifles we shot. When I showed him the rifles he asked if I was any good with them. I thought for a second and replied, "Well, I just won the Super Shoot, I guess that makes me pretty good". He said "Then we'll expect you to bring back the Gold medal for the U.S.". (Christ, now I'm responsible for the pride of the Border Patrol). So, back through the Canadian check point and the border agent is looking down at something and asking me the standard questions again "where are you from, where are you going, is this your first time in Canada" "No, I was here about 15 minutes ago" I replied. He looks up and recognizes me and waves his hand, like "Go, just Go". About a 3hr drive later we arrived at our Hotel. The Four Points Sheraton was located on the west side of Calgary near Olympic Plaza, home of the 1988 Winter games. The Trans-Canada Hwy was right down the street and the Rosebud Silhouette and Benchrest Club was a pleasant 45min drive away in Kananaskis Country at the front range of the Canadian Rockies. Does Benchrest get any better than this? I don't think so. The day after our arrival, Andy and I took a ride out to the range to set up equipment and look around, windows down, sun shining, middle of July, nice! He was throwing powder into the pan of a little jewelry scale and trickling up to weight with a grapefruit spoon (176 HOF points). He was looking at 30.2, 30.5, 30.7 gr of the teams 2018 lot of N133 and they all looked good. I was in the 29.6, 29.9, 30.1 range and my bullet wouldn't take anymore, it has a lot of bearing surface compared to the

bullet Tony & Wayne were shooting. He asked what barrels I had and told me he went through 8 barrels to find one good enough for this event. This guy doesn't fool around. I had planned all along to shoot the team's 2018 powder (it was free!) (just kidding). Bob Jr. used his older known lot of 133. Jeff Graves brought his trusty LT32. Andy Shifflet had his lucky T-8208 but I think he shot some 133 as well. I'm pretty sure everybody else was using the team powder. I will take all the 133 load info I can get, so I looked to Mike, Lee, Jack and Harley for guidance. Jack was shooting my G-67's (now dubbed the "Super-G" since my win at Kelbly's) so his help was invaluable.

The day before the competition began Faye was out with the ladies, she became ill and was hospitalized. Tony went to her side and wouldn't leave her. I didn't know the seriousness of the situation but I'm sure Wayne and Pam did. We were told that Tony wouldn't be shooting and everybody figured that was pretty much "It" for the A-team. We could compete individually but there was no way to get an alternate team member to Calgary in time. Bob thought about asking Nancy to shoot but she was the Match Director so that wouldn't work. "Hey, what about Walt? So he's 90 years old, so what! My mom's 90 and she still gets around. If we can get him to the bench, I know he can shoot, he shoots the winter matches in Phoenix, his grandson David helps him load but he can shoot". Wayne and Bob decided they would talk to his daughter who was accompanying Walt on the trip and see what she thought. The next morning, Walt is ready to go. He's going to shoot Tony's rifle. Wayne's going to get him on and off the bench. Bob is going to clean the rifle, Jack is going to weigh powder and I'm trying to help but basically I'm just in the way. So I do what I can, keep a back-up rifle and cartridge box ready to go behind the bench as we rotate, get his back tag on, keep an eye on him, Hell, everybody's keeping an eye on him.

The World format is like the Super Shoot with one warmup match and one aggregate each day for 4 days (full rotation). There is also one 10 shot 200yd aggregate on the 5th day that is an individual event. My bench assignment had former World champ Brendan Atkinson from Australia to my left and Jari Laulumaa from Finland on my right. Wayne (102) led our team, followed by Bob (202), then Myself (302) and then Walt (402). The Aussies were a four-man tag team of solid shooters that discussed each condition and group they shot. They would gather around their bench next to me at the cease fire which delayed my set up somewhat, but it was no big deal so I let it slide. Jari couldn't get the height he liked with his stool so one of his team mates scrounged up some 2x6 cut offs to boost him up. After he was settled in he looked over at me and smiled as the range master called the line for LV-100.

Conditions were tricky on the side of that hill and if you missed a flag change it was costly. I opened up with a .155 but got caught on my 2nd group and plunked down a .402 (ouch). Brendan and Jari were both shooting well, finishing 5th and 7th on the day. I had to live with my .2300 agg and a 22nd place finish. Jeff Graves won the gold with a .1844. Francois Luciani took the silver and Jack Neary the bronze. The following morning was equally switchy but Jari's timing and tune were impeccable as he shot five 1's in a row and took the Gold medal with a .1832 aggregate. Brendan and I struggled to get a handle on conditions and finished 14th and 19th. Bob Jr. came to life with a .2064 Silver medal finish and Jari's team mate Timo Sarkiniemi took Bronze with a .2164. We set flags that afternoon and readied ourselves for the 200 HV. Friday morning came and brought more of the same tricky weather we had all week. Bob Jr. was on the march to the Heavy grand and I got to watch every group. Bob opens with a .195 and then a .359 and nobody can catch him. He wins the HV Gold with a .2030 aggregate followed by Australia's Bill Jupp and Robert Bisset with the Silver and Bronze. I was hanging in there in 6th while Jari struggled a little for 24th and Brendan caught a big one that put him back into 41st. In the 5th match Andy Laidlaw sticks a .172 (with the Super-G's) for small group. The results came through for the Grand which Bob Jr. won handily with a .2047 Gold medal performance. Jari won the Silver with a .2468 followed by Robert Bisset's .2622 for Bronze. I was lurking around in 4th with Harley Baker and Canada's Bill Mitchell right behind me.

Saturday morning dawned cool, overcast and breezy with scattered showers, completely different from what we shot in all week. Walt had held up well all week but I could tell he was wearing down and this cold front was not going to help. I pinned on his #402 back tag, turned him around and looked into his eyes, deep into his eyes. Those of you with elderly parents know that when you look into their eyes they see you not only now but when you were little and you see them when they were young. It's like stepping through a black hole in time. It was like that with Walt. The feeling was supernatural and we were just along for the ride. Anyway, we got Walt a chair, somebody found him a blanket and they called "relay one to the line". I knew with the weather change my tune would need adjustment. I had been shooting 30.1gr on Friday so I brought that for record with a 3shot sample of 29.8 and 29.5. The 29.5 wandered, the 29.8 dotted up and the 30.1 looked ok with a mid-5. Back at the loading bench I was trying to decide which load to use when Lee Hachigian says to me with a big smile on his face "I just shot a tiny little dot on the sighter with 29.7". Sounds good to me, so I load my 29.8 dot maker and head for the line. I'm watching Bob's target through the spotting scope, boom-low right mothball, boom-touching the first

hole, boom-two inches high right! I hear a collective sigh from the crowd as Bob sits up abruptly and looks around like WTF just happened? He regains his composure, shoots a couple of sighters and finishes his group ("ask not for whom the bell tolls"). Others watching gave me their condolences on our team set-back which kind of flipped a switch inside me. I told Bob "hang in there, we'll get it back". I go to set up and the Aussies are once again huddled around their bench discussing the complexities of the day. I said coldly "you guys are gonna' have to move so I can set up my bench". Brendan says "are you on a mission mate?" I replied "Yes, I am".

I got set up asap and watched the range. Conditions were still variable but not snapping. They were clocking around with a dominant 10 o'clock green that wanted to hang around. I popped a couple sighter shots and they stuck together low right, so I went on record and drilled a big 1. I looked over at Jari who gave me the thumbs up and I signaled him back with 4 fingers (four more), he smiled. After I got reloaded Andy walked up with a big smile and asks me, did you see the leader board, the top 3 spots are the Super-G's, Jack, you and then Me. "Keep it up Andy". Match two brought the same steady green angle and I took it up top for another big 1. Jari smiled again, I flashed three fingers this time (3 more). Match three had the green slot coming and going so I had to stop and go but came out with a mid- 3, Jari smiles again. I flashed him two fingers (two more). Match 4 would not settle in so I took the green when it was there at any angle and held left and right for the movement. Yeah, Nice 2! Jari is grinning ear to ear when I give him the index finger (one more to go). Back at the loading bench, here comes Andy again, "do you have any idea what your agg is". I replied "it must be pretty good because everybody keeps looking at me". Match 5 was a blur, I don't remember exactly what happened, I was on automatic, starting, stopping, holding. After the last shot I was looking at a small 3 and fisted the bench. Jari lip synced a Wow and Brendan gave me a nod. As I start to collect my brass I got a funny feeling and turned around to see Vic and Tyler Edmunds looking at me. At the cease fire they approach me like two muggers in a dark alley. "We need to weigh your gun". They escorted me down to the stat house and luckily my gun weighed the same as when we started four days ago.

Back to the loading tent to wait for the results. I had the lead after my second group and my last one was a 3 so I knew nobody was going to catch me. Jack shot well all week and led USA- C team across the finish line. The results came in. I had the yardage (with a world record .1325 aggregate), LV Grand and 2-Gun. USA-C team took the Gold Medal, USA-A, the Silver and Australia-A, the Bronze. Bill Mitchell took Silver in the two gun with Jari Laulumaa winning the Bronze. Jack Neary's .110 held up for small group (the Super G's strike again). Now it's time for a little celebration so I leave my loading bench the way it is, throw a loose tarp over it and head to the hotel.

The following morning, I remove the tarp and see my little bag of hard candy ripped open and scattered over my bench, all the sugar coating has been licked away. An apple I left has been partially eaten and there is mouse poop everywhere (those bastards!). I was concerned about bears but had never considered a full scale mouse attack! Today is the 10 shot 200yd event. The clouds have cleared but conditions are difficult. Ten shot groups are hard on light varmint barrels so most of us slow

“Ready on the Firing Line...”

By | Lee Hachigian

Have you ever had a good barrel that slowly stops shooting i.e., won't do like it used to? Unfortunately, every round we send down the barrel causes some level of wear on the rifling. Those in the throat area can have a significant impact the tune and your ability to shoot small. Below are what several seasoned veterans have to say on the subject.

QUESTION

Do you change your bullet seating depth as your barrel wears? If so, why and when (appropriately how many rounds on the barrel)?

Gary Ocock

I change seating depth all the time; most of the time I don't know why; I'm just changing something in the quest. This goes along with powder charge and powders as well. I will have with me as many as 6 different powders both at practice and matches as well.

Jeff Peinhardt

I have competed exclusively with Krieger barrels for the last 7 years. I find with their barrels have similar patterns to rounds fired and seating depth needed. I always shoot about .030 into the lands from touch for the first 200 rounds. At around 200 to 450 rounds, I usually move seating into the lands from .003" to .010" depends on the barrel. I typically test this on the sighter during a match at 200 yards.

Jack Neary

I do not arbitrarily change my seating depth based upon throat wear. I believe there should always be a cause for me to change my load or seating depth. If I see my group shapes start to change, I will usually increase my load. If, by chance, I am changing my loads and not seeing an improvement in my group sizes, that is a clear indicator my seating depth is slightly off and needs to be addressed. I will then move my bullet out of the case by .003" longer OAL. Many times, this correction will snap my rifle back in-tune!

Harley Baker

Yes Appx. every 200 rounds

Craig Rowe

Rarely!

Donald Rosette

If I lose accuracy, I will change my bullet seating depth if necessary due to wear. I believe that happens within the first few hundred rounds, but after that no change is necessary.

Greg King

Once I find the right spot, I don't change my seating depth much but I will. Change a little depending on the size of my groups at a match.

Jeffrey Gaidos

I will check the jamb length over time and play around with seating depth if the barrel does not seem to shoot like it used to. If I am shooting at the jamb and the jamb value changes then I might move the bullet out to keep the same relationship with the jamb value. I will check the jamb value after a couple hundred rounds.

Joel Nader

My Super-G bullet likes "touch" so I stay keenly aware of throat erosion. I check for faint, even rifling marks on a dummy round with a stripped bolt at the end of each days shooting and advance seating depth when needed. Now it's fashionable to shoot 7-10.5 bullets at excessively hard jam with heavy .269 neck tension. The bullet won't even push back into the case, it just gets engraved more deeply into the rifling. No need to advance seating depth with that kind of set up.

Victor Potts

Normally the seating depth does not change. If things start to go south during a match, then perhaps .002 in or out to verify.

Lee Hachigian

I try to practice before each match, at which time I'm able to determine if my previous load and seating depth still works accordingly. Most of the time, I do not make a change in the seating. However, over the years I've found that a .002" increase into the lands after each 300-400 rounds normally maintains the accuracy in my barrels. ■

Faye passed away a few days after the event, I'm glad Tony was by her side. I've heard that he won't be shooting anymore. Walt passed away about a year later, I'm glad he got one last moment in the sun doing what he loved. Bob Jr. suffered a stroke and we almost lost him, I'm glad he has fully recovered. I wanted to write this story down before it was all forgotten.

Am I happy? Yes, I'm happy. I made the team and we brought home the Silver Medal. I'm happy the team Gold came home with Jack, Harley, Jeff and Gary. I'm happy Debbie got to have fun with the ladies. I'm happy Gavin gets to remember his Grandpa when he was on top of the world. That's enough for me. Besides, I get to look at those record targets on the wall every time I walk by. ■
