

2024 NBRSA 600 Yard National Championship

When: September 14 & 15, 2024. September 16th is reserved for a “Rain Day” if needed.

Where: Upper Nisqually Sportsman’s Club (UNSC) in Eatonville WA.

Time: Match start time: 8AM Gate will be operational @ 6:30AM on match mornings.

Registration: Preregistration is required. Registration form should be available around June 1st on the NBRSA website.

Match Fees: See Registration Form for details.

Format: Two-day NBRSA 600 Yard Event [rules](#) apply.

- 12 targets shot over 2 days. 6 LG and 6 HG total.
- 3 LG and 3 HG targets each day.
- 45 Record shots per day: 15 LG and 30 HG
- There is a sighter period prior to each record target. Unlimited sighters during the sighter period.
- Recommend 75 round minimum per day.
- Range does not have pits. We will have the following available for sight in:
 - Clay pigeons on the bank for rough sight in
 - 12 inch Shoot-N-Cs **OR** ShotMarker ETargets may be available for sight in only.
 - If you have a spotting scope with sufficient magnification – recommend you bring it.
- Specific relay format will be dependent on the total number of shooters.

Practice Day: There will be a practice session on Friday September 13th from 9am – 2pm.
The practice/range fee is \$10 per shooter. We will be using ShotMarker ETargets for practice.

Lodging: There is a hotel/motel 2 miles from the range in Eatonville WA. Other lodging options are ~15+ miles north of the range in Graham, WA, or the South Hill area.

Range Entry: The range has a gated entry. For non-members, a temporary gate code will be emailed prior to the match. The gate will be operational at 6:30AM on match mornings. If you are coming in an RV the day or two before the match, please contact us for arrangements.

Misc: Miscellaneous items:

- Light Lunch will be provided on Saturday 9/14. More info to follow.
- Please bring your own shooting stool.

Q&A:

1. Where is the 600 Yard range?

- a. After entering the club through the gate – turn left and proceed several hundred yards just past the clubhouse. You will find the 600-yard covered firing line with 10 concrete benches.

2. I am used to shooting at NBRSA matches with pits. Any rule differences since this match does not have pits?

- a. Shooters/Spectators behind the firing line may assist/coach shooters on where their sighter shots are hitting during the sighter period only. No spotting/coaching during record targets. If you have a spotting scope/tripod with enough magnification – please bring them.
- b. Prior to the record target period – the Line Officer will verify that shooters have the proper number of rounds out on the bench for the target being shot (5 for LG and 10 for HG).

3. Miscellaneous Rifle Info:

- a. Muzzle attachments such as tuners are legal. Suppressors are not allowed.
- b. Muzzle brakes are allowed – but they cannot be ‘clamshell’ or any other design that exit gasses to the rear. Radial brakes are allowed.
- c. NBRSA Light Gun (LG) class weight limit is 22.5 pounds. LG rifles will be weighed after the completion of all record LG targets are completed for a given relay.

4. Can I bring/set up Wind Flags?

- a. Shooters may bring and place their own wind flags.
- b. If you are bringing your own flags, please come early during the first match morning so you have ample time to set your flags. Wind flags must be set up 30 minutes prior to the start of the match.

5. Do I have to be a NBRSA member to shoot the match? Do I have to be a UNSC member?

- a. Yes, you are required to be a NBRSA member to shoot the National Match. Please remember to bring your membership card with you.
- b. No, you do not have to be an Upper Nisqually Sportsmen’s Club (UNSC) member to shoot the match. For non-UNSC members, a gate code for entry will be emailed out a week prior to the match. The gate code should be operational for all event days.

6. Can I sign up on the morning of the match?

- a. **No registrations will be accepted the day of the match.** Pre-registration is required. Please check the registration form for details/deadlines.
